The **Penny for Pinellas** is a one-cent sales tax that allows us to fund new capital projects without relying on property taxes. The Penny benefits our economy and adds value to our county by funding roads, bridges, parks, drainage and other capital improvement projects. First approved by voters in 1989, the Penny for Pinellas will be on the ballot on March 13, 2007. This is not a new tax – it's a renewal of an existing one-cent sales tax paid by all who spend money in the county, including tourists and other visitors who contribute about a third. The Penny gets divided between the county and cities and helps make Pinellas County a better place to live, work and visit.
