Responding to Ms. Bock's concerns, Mr. Bailey related that staff notified residents within 600 feet of the property, exceeding the code requirement of 200 feet; that the County Commission hearing will be moved to August 21 at 6:00 P.M.; and that the LPA meetings are always held at 9:00 A.M.
