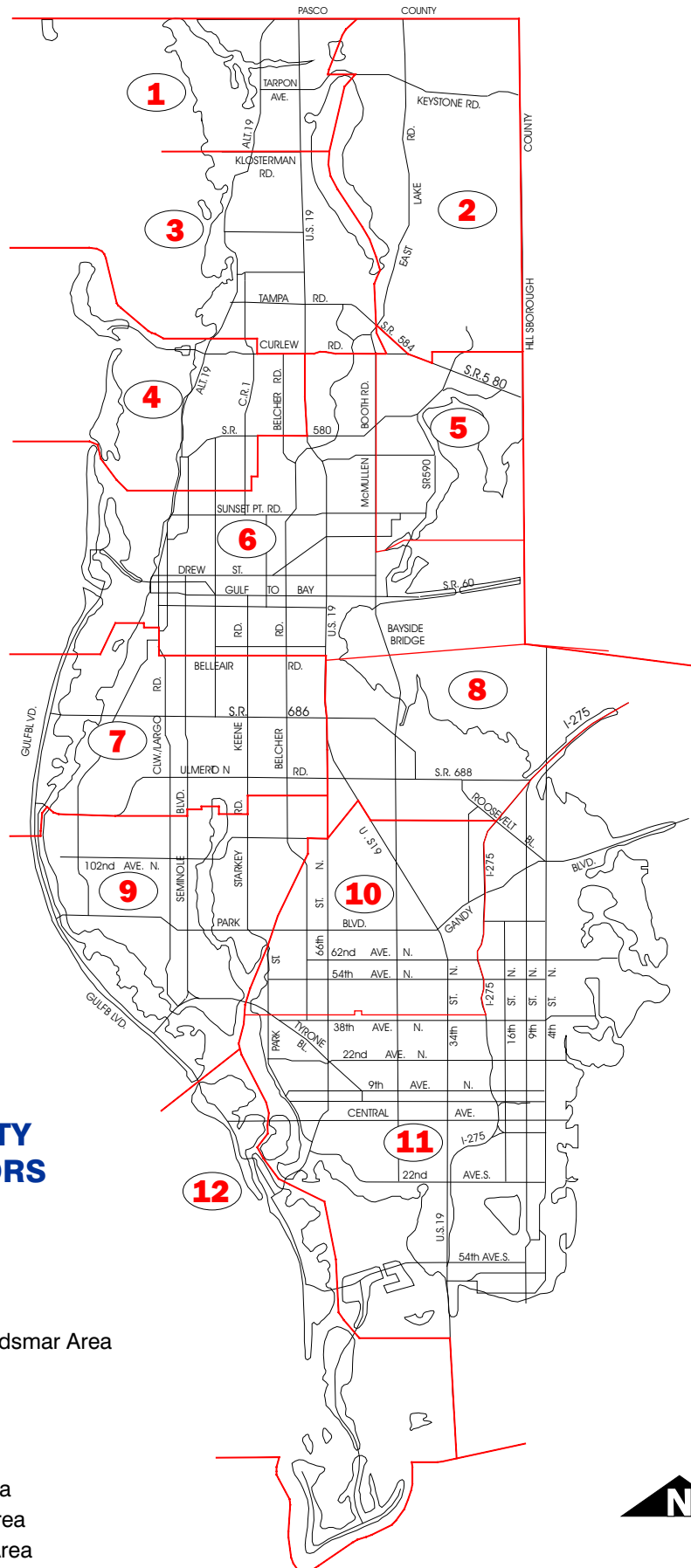

3. Tourist Population is the impact that tourists have on public services and facilities that are comparable to permanent residents.

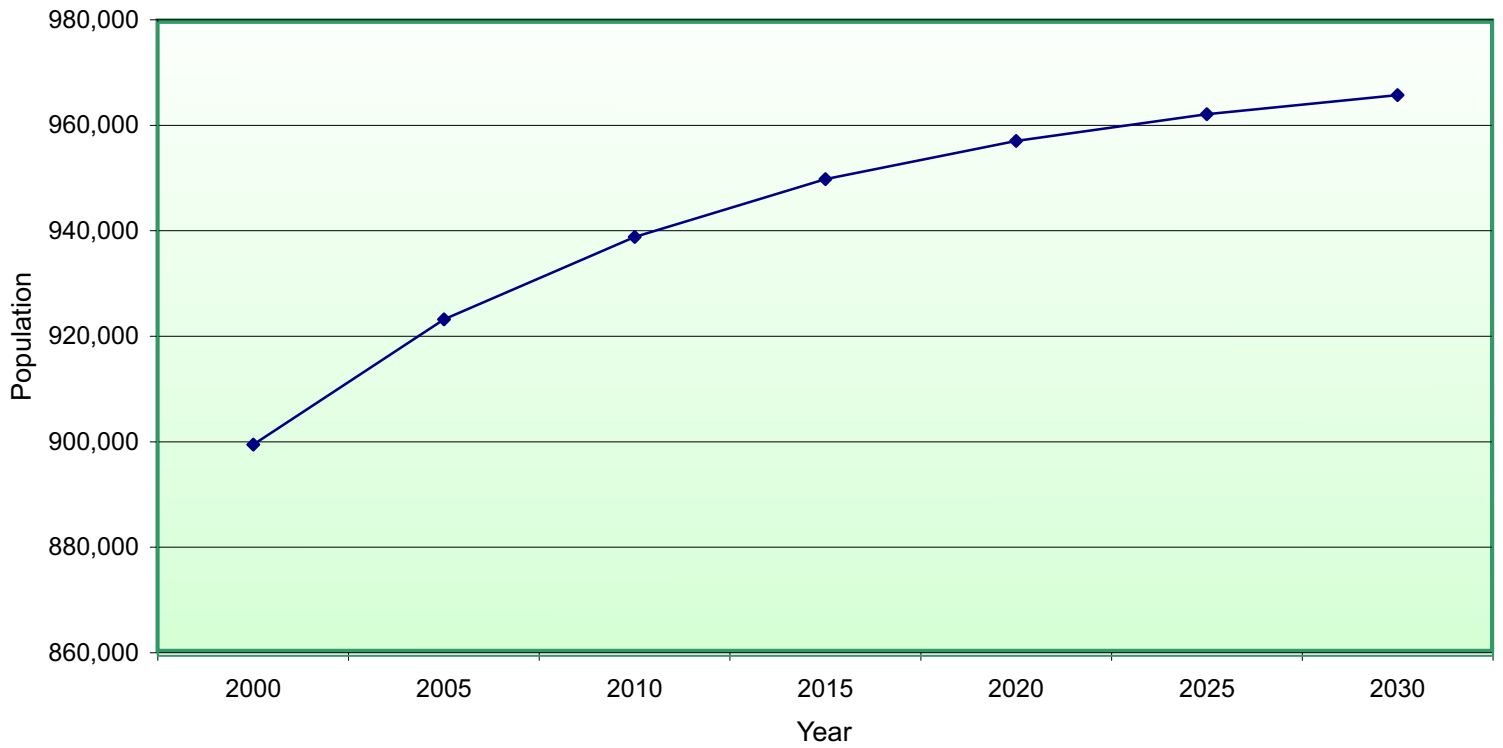
