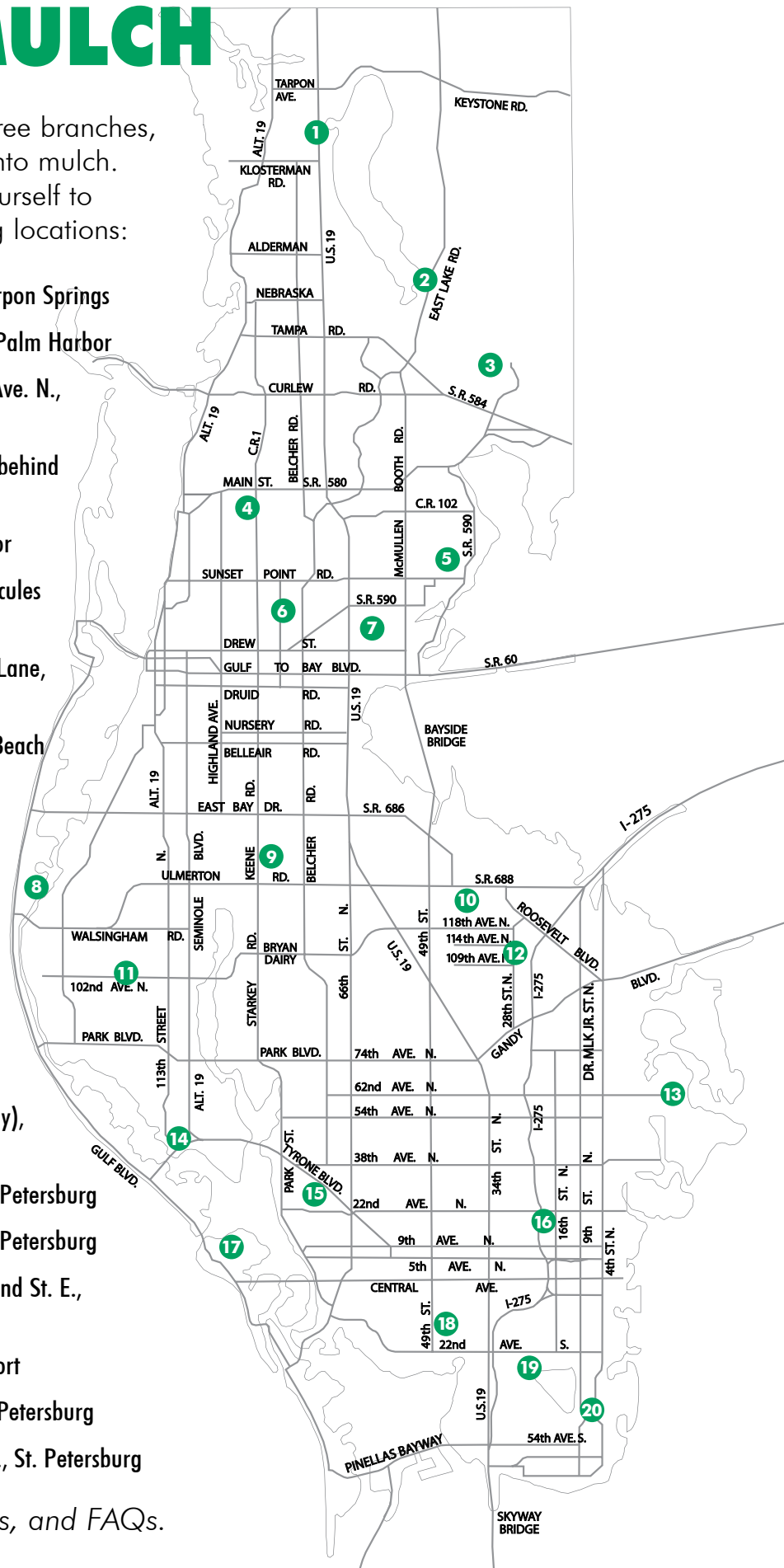


RECYCLED MULCH

In Pinellas County, yard trash (such as tree branches, grass clippings and leaves) is recycled into mulch. Bring a pitchfork or shovel, and help yourself to **unlimited FREE mulch** at the following locations:

FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS

What is recycled mulch?

Clean loads of yard trimmings (such as tree branches and leaves) are processed into mulch that is offered free to residents.

How much mulch can I take at a time?

There is no limit while supplies last. Please ensure that your load is covered and secured.

Is recycled mulch safe?

Yes. Weed seeds, pest insects, and plant diseases are eliminated using a natural heating and decomposition process prescribed by the University of Florida. The result is a high-quality landscaping product.

Why is free mulch provided?

Recycling yard waste into mulch keeps usable material out of the landfill, and provides a useful product for citizens. Mulch not only makes landscaping more attractive, but it also saves water by conserving soil moisture.
