You may also visit us at the Largo Home Depot at 10475 Ulmerton Road in Largo on **Saturday, April 5** from 9 a.m. to 2 p.m.



Many everyday household items contain hazardous materials that shouldn't go in your garbage can. Items containing hazardous materials include cleansers, automotive fluids, household batteries, fertilizers, pesticides, marine flares, pool chemicals, paint products, fluorescent lamps, computers, televisions, and other electronics.

Pinellas County Utilities and the Home Depot provide mobile collections as a **FREE** service to all citizens. Businesses that wish to bring electronics or chemical waste to any collection should make advance arrangements for drop-off and payment.
