These are hazardous waste. Do NOT dispose with regular trash!

1. **Reduce** waste by repairing a broken TV instead of replacing it (see “Television & VCR– Service & Repair” in the Yellow Pages). There are more than 30 television repair stores in Pinellas County, and many offer in-home service.
2. **Reduce** waste by keeping an analog television. You can:
 - a) Continue to use the television if you have cable or satellite service. Check with your cable or satellite company to find out if new equipment is needed.
 - b) Purchase a [converter box](#) (if you depend on an antenna for reception).
 - c) Use the TV as a game monitor or video player.
3. **Reduce** waste if you choose to buy a new TV by selecting an [Energy Star TV](#).
4. **Ask** the retailer to haul away your old TV if you are buying a new television which is being delivered.
5. **Drop off** a working or broken TV at a Pinellas County [mobile collection](#) or [HEC₃ facility](#) for recycling (free for residents).
6. *St. Petersburg residents:* The City of St. Petersburg offers [curbside pick-up of TVs](#) for recycling. Call 893-7398 to request a free pickup.
7. *Clearwater residents:* The City of Clearwater offers an [Electronics Collection Day](#) free **drop off** on the last Wednesday of each month from 7am-3pm for city residents (not businesses) at the recycling center at 1701 N. Hercules Ave. (562-4933). Bring up to six electronics and a utility bill for proof of residency.
8. *Dunedin residents or businesses:* The City of Dunedin offers **curbside pick-up** of TVs and other electronic items for a recycling fee of \$17.11 per item. Call 298-3215, ext. 21 so the item(s) may be collected promptly. Please mark the item(s) with your street address.
9. **Drop off** a small TV (that will fit inside a box measuring 24” x 18” x 18”) at [Office Depot](#) for recycling. The fee for a [Tech Recycling Box](#) is \$15.

10. **Drop off** at [Best Buy](#) for recycling ([program info](#)). There is a fee of \$10 which is offset with a \$10 gift card. TVs over 32" or console TVs are not accepted.
11. **Drop off** at [eCycling](#), 7300 Bryan Dairy Rd., Suite 475, Largo, M-F 8am-5pm for free recycling (toll-free 877-432-9254).
12. **Sell** working TVs through the newspaper, yard sale, or [CraigsList For Sale](#).
13. **Trade in** an HD TV for a [Radio Shack](#) gift card through the mail. Shipping is free. The trade-in payment will vary, based on the value of the television.
14. **Donate** a working television:
 - a) [Thrift store or charity](#) (call first since some do not accept TVs)
 - b) Use [Freecycle](#). Sign up for a local group (Clearwater, Clearwater Beach, North Pinellas, Largo, or St. Petersburg).
 - c) Use [CraigsList Free Stuff](#).
 - d) Free newspaper ads—[St. Petersburg Times](#) (3 lines) or [Tampa Bay Newspapers](#) (15 words)
 - e) Use [Excess Access](#) which matches donors with wish lists of local non-profit organizations.
15. **Business** options:
 - a) See options listed above.
 - b) **Drop off** TVs at a Pinellas County [mobile collection](#) or an [EnviroBusiness Day](#) event at the HEC₃ facility (fee of 15¢ per pound).
 - c) **Contact** an [Electronics Recycling and Disposal Company](#).
