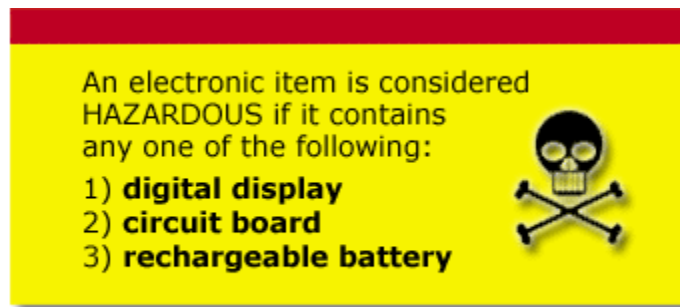

Electronics, non-hazardous

air purifier, blender, bread machine, blow dryer, camera (film), can opener, clock, coffee grinder, coffee maker, curling iron, dehumidifier, frying pan, fan, fondue maker, food processor, heater, ice cream maker, iron, juicer, mixer, paper shredder, popcorn popper, pressure cooker, razor/shaver, sandwich maker, slow cooker, steamer, toaster, toaster oven, toothbrush, vacuum cleaner, waffle maker, wok

Small electronic items (such as those listed above) are usually NOT hazardous and may be disposed in the regular trash. However, please check the item carefully:



1. **Reduce** waste by repairing a broken item instead of replacing it.
2. If in doubt as to whether an item is hazardous or not, please **drop off** at a Pinellas County [mobile collection](#) or the [HEC₃ facility](#) for recycling (free for residents). Our staff will properly dispose of any electronic item you bring.
3. **Donate** working items:
 - a) [Thrift store or charity](#) (call first since some do not accept electronics)
 - b) Use [Freecycle](#). Sign up for a local group (Clearwater, Clearwater Beach, North Pinellas, Largo, or St. Petersburg).
 - c) Use [Craigslist Free Stuff](#)
 - d) Use free newspaper ads—[St. Petersburg Times](#) (3 lines) or [Tampa Bay Newspapers](#) (15 words)
4. **Drop off** small electronics for recycling at Recycling Services of Florida, 3560 - 126th Ave. N., Clearwater (573-9150) from 6am-5pm Mon.-Fri.
