How to Recycle MORE!

Thank you for recycling! Your efforts truly do make a difference. **Here's how you can recycle MORE—no matter where you live in Pinellas County:**

✓ No curbside?

Do you live in an area without curbside recycling, such as unincorporated Pinellas, St. Petersburg, Madeira Beach, or Redington Shores? You can:

- 1) Use drop-off recycling sites (click for [map](#)).
- 2) Sign up with a curbside recycler (see "Curbside Recycling Options" at right).

✓ Limited recycling available?

Do you want to recycle more than your city collects? For example, if your city's program doesn't include glass or paper items, you can:

- 1) Use drop-off recycling sites (click for [map](#)).
- 2) Sign up with a curbside recycler for supplemental service (see "Curbside Recycling Options" at right).

✓ Live in an apartment or condo?

Do you live in a multi-family unit that doesn't provide recycling? You can:

- 1) Encourage your leasing or management company to set up a program.
- 2) Use drop-off recycling sites (click for [map](#)).
- 3) Sign up with an on-site recycler (see the [ABC List](#) for [Apartments](#), [Businesses & Condos](#)).

✓ Want to recycle at work?

You and your co-workers can recycle on the job:

- 1) See [Cutting Waste at Work](#) to find free resources for setting up a program.
- 2) Collect items such as cans or paper, and take turns transporting them to the closest drop-off recycling site (click for [map](#)).
- 3) Sign up with an on-site recycler (see the [ABC List](#) for [Apartments](#), [Businesses & Condos](#)).

CURBSIDE RECYCLING OPTIONS (for single family homes)

Contact one of the following companies if you would like curbside recycling service at your house. These companies may be able to provide a curbside bin if you don't have one (*for example, if you live in an unincorporated area*) or if you want to supplement your city's program (*for example, if your city's program does not include glass*). DROP-OFF RECYCLING ([click for map](#))

For your convenience, our drop-off bins have just two categories: paper and containers:

PAPER

- ▶ cardboard
- ▶ mixed paper
- ▶ newspapers

CONTAINERS

- ▶ aluminum cans
- ▶ plastic bottles
- ▶ steel cans
(NO glass)

- ▶ cooking oil (*only at sites marked **)

- 48 A.L. Anderson Park**, 39699 US Hwy. 19 N., between Klosterman Rd. and Tarpon Ave., Tarpon Springs (7 am -sunset)
- 49 Bank of America**, 10900 Seminole Blvd., between 102nd Ave. and 110th Ave., Seminole
- 50 Brooker Creek Education Center** (look for a sign just before the main parking lot), 3940 Keystone Rd., Tarpon Springs (Thu. - Sun. 7am - one hour before sunset)
- 51 Curlew Retention Pond**, 1825 Curlew Rd., between Belcher Rd. and CR 1, Dunedin
- 52 East Lake Community Library** parking lot, 4125 East Lake Rd., Palm Harbor
- 53 John Chesnut Sr. Park**, southwest corner of Sandy Point Rd. and East Lake Rd., north of the park entrance, Palm Harbor (7am -sunset)
- 54 Lake Seminole Park**, 10015 Park Blvd., east of Seminole Blvd., Seminole (7am -sunset)
- 55 North County Service Center**, 29582 US Hwy. 19 N., between Curlew Rd. and SR 580, Dunedin
- 56 Oakhurst Water Tower**, 113th Ln. and 74th Ave., west of 113th St. N., Seminole *
- 57 Pinellas County Extension**, 12520 Ullmerton Rd., just north of the Ullmerton entrance on the 125th St. N. frontage road, Largo (7am - 7pm).
- 58 Pinellas County Utilities Solid Waste**, 109th Ave. N. & 28th St., St. Petersburg
- 59 Sand Key Park**, 1060 Gulf Blvd., Clearwater Beach (7am -sunset)
- 60 Walmart** parking lot, 23106 US Hwy. 19 N. at N.E. Coachman Rd., Clearwater

DROP-OFF RECYCLING continued:

- 61 William E. Dunn Water Reclamation Facility**, 4111 Dunn Dr., off Alt. 19, 2 miles south of Klosterman Rd., Palm Harbor *



RECYCLING GUIDELINES

No plastic bags please!

▶ PAPER BIN

Cardboard – Clean, empty, dry corrugated (3-layer) cardboard boxes or packaging. Please flatten boxes. No pizza boxes.

Mixed Paper – Any clean, dry paper item that tears, such as white or colored paper, shredded paper, office paper, magazines, catalogs, phone books, junk mail, envelopes, wrapping paper, and paperboard items such as cereal boxes or paper towel rolls. No paper towels or tissues.

Newspapers – Clean and dry newspapers (including inserts). No string or twine. It's okay to put them inside a paper bag.

Phone Books – Included with mixed paper. Remove plastic wrap, bag, or magnets.

▶ CONTAINER BIN

(Please rinse & crush items if possible)

Aluminum Cans – Empty aluminum cans used for drinks or food (such as soda or cat food cans).

Plastic Bottles – Empty plastic bottles with a “neck” (opening smaller than the base) such as water, soda, shampoo, or ketchup bottles. No need to check for #1 or #2—just “check for a neck”. Bottles only; no tubs, cups, or bags. Labels okay. No caps or lids.

Steel (Tin) Cans – Empty steel cans used for food such as soup or vegetable cans. Labels and lids okay. No aerosol cans or paint cans.

▶ COOKING OIL TANK (*only at sites marked **)

Cooking Oil – Used liquid cooking oil (such as oil from a turkey fryer). No solids or motor oil.
