**Recommended Action:**

I RECOMMEND THAT THE BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS (BCC) APPOINT THE FOLLOWING SEVEN INDIVIDUALS TO THE PINELLAS COUNTY HISTORIC PRESERVATION BOARD.

**Summary Explanation/Background:**

The Board of County Commissioners (BCC) amended the Historic Preservation Code on July 24, 2012. The amendments, among other changes, created a Historic Preservation Board (HPB) whose responsibilities are identified in the amended Code. The HPB replaces the prior Historic Preservation Advisory Board because some of the responsibilities of the new Board in the amended Code are no longer advisory.

The HPB is to be comprised of nine voting members and one non-voting member. Each member of the BCC nominates one member of the Historic Preservation Board, and the BCC jointly nominates two at-large members, with the BCC appointing the entire nine members. The BCC also appoints two alternates to the HPB to serve during the absence of any regular member. The BCC also appoints one of its own members to the HPB to serve as its chairman. The chairman is an ex-officio, non-voting member of the HPB. On December 11, 2012, the BCC appointed Commissioner Justice to serve as the chairman.

To qualify as a certified local government, the terms of appointment to the HPB must be staggered. Consequently, the initial appointments to the HPB are being staggered at one, two and three years; subsequent appointments will be for three years in order to retain the initial staggered terms and comply with the Historic Preservation Code. In some cases, the length of the initial appointment is at the request of the person being appointed.

On February 12, 2013 the BCC appointed four individuals to the Historic Preservation Board. Nomination of the following seven individuals for appointment to the Historic Preservation Board will complete the composition of the Board.

1. John Peter Barie nominated by Commissioner Kenneth Welch to serve for three years.
2. Emily Elwyn nominated by Commissioner Charlie Justice to serve for three years.
3. Gina Clayton nominated by Commissioner Janet Long to serve for three years.

4. Brian Smith nominated at large to serve for two years.
5. Vincent Luisi nominated at large to serve for two years.

6. Loretta Wyandt nominated as an alternate to serve for three years.
7. Dwight Holmes nominated as an alternate to serve for three years.

## *PRINCIPAL PROJECTS OF HISTORIC SIGNIFICANCE*

### **Bowery Savings Bank Historic Restoration**

**New York, New York**

Designed by McKim, Meade & White and completed in 1894 the facility was completely restored from top to bottom while remaining open for business. The work included restoration of the original lay light, cleaning of marble and bronze decorative detailing and the cleaning, repainting and relighting of the vaulted ceiling. The work was performed based on drawings and renderings discovered by the restoration team in the bank's archives.

### **Restoration of the Statue of Liberty**

**New York, New York**

As a Partner at Swanke Hayden Connell Architects it was my privilege to serve as a member of a large team responsible for the restoration which began in 1982 and concluding with the statue's centennial celebrated on July 3-6, 1986. I chaired our "partnership team" with a mission to review technology protocol, project management, and sequencing of staff to insure delivery of our firm's services so as to meet the deadline of completing execution of the project in time for the centennial celebration.

### **New York Athletic Club**

**New York, New York**

Designed by York & Sawyer, the 22-story 'City House' opened in 1929. Facilities include 150 hotel rooms, gym and pool; tap room, restaurant, squash/handball courts and meeting rooms.

Serving as the Architectural Advisor to the Board of Governors I was responsible for master planning and phasing of the renovation. Work included facade and parapet restoration, a new women's locker room, upgrading telecommunications and data service, modernization of the bath/cabana and implementation of a club-wide ADA compliance program.

### **Student Center Expansion Project, University of North Carolina - Wilmington**

**Wilmington, North Carolina**

This \$24.0 million project, completed in 2006 included 4 phases. The design challenge was to blend the new building and additions to two existing buildings with the campus-wide Georgian architectural vocabulary. As project manager for all phases I was also the project manager and restoration/renovation lead architect for the existing University Union, and conversion of the Burney Center into a 900 seat ballroom-conference center. The renovation scope encompassed major additions to the façade of the University Union and a complete reconfiguration of the Burney exterior and interior. Design reviews had to meet intense scrutiny and oversight throughout the university's leadership hierarchy beginning with Facilities Planning & Design and ending in the Chancellor's office.

**Cameron Indoor Stadium Stair Tower/AC Addition, Duke University  
Durham, North Carolina**

Home of the Blue Devils 2001 NCAA Basketball Champions the stadium lacked air-conditioning, adequate emergency egress and sanitary facilities for women which was a serious concern to university officials. The stair tower addition was the subject of intense design study because of the need to blend in with and respect the campus wide Gothic style of traditional architecture of the west campus. The project required careful phasing to respect the demands of the basketball schedule and summer volleyball camps.

**Williams Cafeteria, Addition & Modernization, North Carolina A&T State University  
Greensboro, North Carolina**

This project began with a condition evaluation of this 25 year old facility, concluding that modernization and expansion to double seating capacity was indeed feasible. Food service is redesigned as a scramble system featuring hot entrees, soups & salad, a "Euro" Grill and other stations. The facility will introduce a Chancellor's Dining Room and Food Court on the ground level. The kitchen will remain in full operation during the fifteen month duration of this \$7.5 mil project.
