The recent Tierra Verde Community Association's, Monday, May 12th Board of Directors meeting, the subject was approached regarding Tierra Verde Fire District being the primary responder to two Fire Districts; Tierra Verde and Fort DeSoto. Mr. Mike Cooksey was present, representing the County staff. An unexpected irony during our discussion, was the "call out" of our Fire Crew for a structural fire at Fort De Soto Park which made the Tampa Bay Times Tuesday, May 13th edition.

In continuing the discussion, Fort DeSoto Park hosts 2,700,000 people and 850,000 cars each year, and we feel it is unjust for the 5,000 residents of Tierra Verde to support the counties largest park for the \$1,000.00 a year paid to the Tierra Verde Fire District. We have no knowledge of any other Fire District in Pinellas County having such a burden.

As a result, a Resolution was duly and unanimously passed to enter into negotiations with the County to provide additional staffing/manpower to the Tierra Verde Fire District. I have enclosed the Resolution No. 2014-03 for your review.

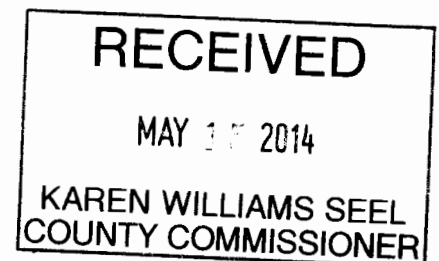

RESOLUTION NO. 2014-03

A RESOLUTION OF THE TIERRA VERDE COMMUNITY ASSOCIATION, INCORPORATION AND THE DIRECTORS OF THE ASSOCIATION RESOLVED THAT THE TIERRA VERDE COMMUNITY ASSOCIATION ENTER NEGOTIATIONS WITH THE COUNTY FOR THE COUNTY TO PROVIDE THE EXTRA MANPOWER IN STAFFING THE TIERRA VERDE FIRE STATION.

Whereas, the County Park of Fort Desoto accounts for approximately 22 % of Tierra Verde Fire District's calls.

And, Whereas over 50% of Tierra Verde Fire District's calls are out of Tierra Verde Fire District.

And, Whereas, when responding out of the District, Tierra Verde is covered by a Station located off the Island.

And, Whereas, Tierra Verde is an Island accessible only by a functionally obsolete draw bridge.

And, Whereas, the County pays one thousand dollars per year toward the support of Fort Desoto.

And, Whereas, the residents of Tierra Verde support financially not only Tierra Verde, but Fort DeSoto, a County park drawing 2,700,000 visitors each year.


And, Whereas, adding one fireman per shift would allow the truck to remain on station when an Fire/EMS calls are made providing redundant and more adequate support for Tierra Verde and Isla Del Sol (Primary response—out of district.).

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Board of Directors of the Tierra Verde Community Association, Inc., acting in the interests and the safety of its residents, **HIGHLY RECOMMENDS** that the Pinellas County Board of Commissioners as the authority for the Tierra Verde Fire District enters into negotiations to provide extra manpower in staffing for the Tierra Verde Fire Station.

FUTHERMORE, BE IT RESOVLED that the Board of Directors requests this action is taken as soon as possible by the Pinellas County Commissioners to relieve the stress on the community and our firefighters.

THE FOREGOING RESOLUTION WAS DULY PASSED AND ADOPTED UNANIMOUSLY THIS 12TH DAY OF MAY 2014.
