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Charter Review Commission vacancies announced

Applications are now being accepted for appointments to the Pinellas County Charter Review Commission.

Every eight years, the Board of County Commissioners appoints a Charter Review Commission to review the Pinellas County Charter and make independent recommendations to amend the Charter. The Charter Review Commission has direct access to the ballot, where the voters of Pinellas County may consider these amendments.

The Charter Review Commission has 13 members:

- Nine citizens
- One county commissioner
- One constitutional officer
- One member of the legislative delegation
- One city elected official

Applications must be received no later than the close of business on Monday, June 1. The Board of County Commissioners will review all applications and make their selection at the Tuesday, June 23, Board of County Commissioners meeting.

Each commissioner will appoint one citizen member of the Charter Review Commission, and the remaining two citizen members will be selected by the Board of County Commissioners as a whole. Citizen appointments may not be elected officials.
