Unified Personnel Board vacancy deadline extended

Résumés and applications are now being accepted for an appointment to the Unified Personnel Board.

The board is the final authority in all matters relating to personnel policy and actions for offices, agencies and employees of the Pinellas County Board of County Commissioners, Clerk of the Circuit Court, Property Appraiser, Tax Collector and Supervisor of Elections who are subject to the act creating the Unified Personnel System.

It reviews and adopts classified employee pay and classification plans, adopts rules and determines grievance and termination appeals. The Personnel Department, established by special act, and its director, are responsible for fostering and developing programs for the improvement of employee effectiveness, including training, communications, insurance, safety, health, counseling and welfare.

The board has seven members. Two members are appointed by the Pinellas County Board of County Commissioners, two by the Constitutional Officers as a group, two by the county employees through the Employees Advisory Council and one by the above board members as a group for two-year terms. Applicants must be residents of Pinellas County for at least two years prior to the date of the appointment.

The board meets the first Thursday of each month at 6:30 p.m. in the Assembly Room at 315 Court St. in Clearwater.

Applications and résumés must be received no later than the close of business on Friday, Dec. 5. The Board of County Commissioners will review all résumés and applications and make their selection at a future meeting.
