

RESIDENTIAL LANDSCAPE GUIDE & APPROVED SPECIES LIST
PINELLAS COUNTY DEPARTMENT DEVELOPMENT REVIEW SERVICES
EFFECTIVE OCTOBER 1, 2000

EXPLANATION:

This list gives general information about foliage, height at maturity, flower/fruit, and salt tolerance for each species. A majority of the list is composed of native species. Although other trees may be planted, they **will not** count toward total plant requirements.

GUIDELINES:

Tree replant requirements are based on the size of the lot and the number of existing trees remaining on the upland or buildable portion of the lot. If 6 or more replants are required, a minimum of 2 different tree species must be used.

RECOMMENDATIONS:

1. Avoid planting pines, trees that drop fruit or nuts, and large trees near driveways or walkways that may later be disturbed by the tree's growth.
2. Utilize short growth trees under power lines.

REQUIREMENTS:

1. Cabbage Palms will count as ½ of a tree towards the replant requirement, meaning that if a Cabbage Palm is chosen as the replant for a one tree requirement, two Cabbage Palms must be planted. No more than 30% of total trees on lot may be of this species.
2. The replants must be a minimum of one and one-half inch (1-1/2") caliper and six feet (6') tall at the time of planting. The trees must be of Nursery Grade #1 or better.
3. Trees shall not be planted on the right-of-way for the purpose of meeting the above replant requirements.
