



What You Need To Know About HEPATITIS A

HOW IT'S SPREAD:

- Close contact with a person who has hepatitis A
- Eating food or drinking something contaminated with hepatitis A
- Touching a surface contaminated with hepatitis A
- Oral to anal, finger to anal, or object to anal sexual contact with an infected partner

Hepatitis A is a virus that can harm your liver. It is passed through the feces of an infected person.



SYMPTOMS:

- Fever
- Feeling tired
- Stomach pain
- Nausea and vomiting
- Diarrhea
- Dark urine
- Gray-colored stool
- Yellowing of skin or eyes

If you think you may have hepatitis A, contact your doctor immediately.

HIGH-RISK GROUPS:

- Those who use drugs
- Those currently homeless or couch-surfing
- Men who have sex with men
- Those recently in jail or prison
- Travelers to countries where hepatitis A is common



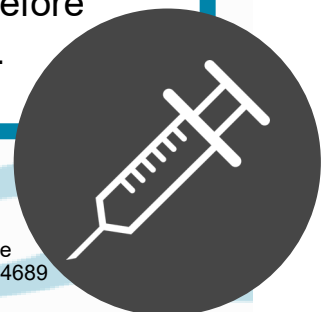
PREVENTION:
