INTRODUCTION

The mission of Heritage Village is to collect, preserve and interpret the history of Pinellas County within the context of Florida history.

What began in 1977 as 10 acres with a few random structures has evolved into the county's largest outdoor living history museum. Stroll through the 21 acres of natural pine and palmetto landscape and discover the county's history as interpreted around the themes of ***Coastal Living, Agriculture, Community Life*** and ***Tourism***. Home to the Pinellas County's oldest and most historic buildings, these structures have been moved from all over the county and preserved, reconstructed or rebuilt so that we can continue to literally touch our area's history.

The Treasure Trove of Pinellas History

The Heritage Village Archives & Library is one of the most comprehensive collections of materials on Pinellas County history. It includes the largest historic photograph collection in the county with over 9,000 images. The research library contains more than 3,500 volumes on Florida and Pinellas County history, historic preservation and antiques and collectibles. Additional holdings include thousands of postcards, letters, maps, rare books and special collections.

HOW TO USE THIS GUIDE

This Guide to the Archives & Library of Heritage Village is arranged in nine major sections.

1). GENERAL COLLECTIONS

General Collections include four categories of printed and microfilmed materials:

- a.) *Books, telephone and city directories, yearbooks and periodicals,*
- b.) *Clip files of newspaper and magazine clippings, and photocopied extracts.*
- c.) *Clip files with original printed material (such as vintage brochures, pamphlets, manuscripts, letters and etc.); and*
*All clip file materials are classified and arranged under a uniform subject heading arrangement (see Appendix 1).
- d.) *Microfilmed federal and state census returns, newspapers, military and other records (including microfiche).*

2). SPECIAL COLLECTIONS

Special Collections include large collections of donated printed materials, the size of which prohibits their inclusion within the General Collections. These collections are therefore boxed separately and held within the Archives, and are arranged and classified under the same uniform subject headings as are used for the General Collections (see Appendix 1).

3). PHOTOGRAPH COLLECTIONS

The Photograph Collection contains more than 9,000 photographs on a variety of subjects relating to the history of Pinellas County. Copies of photographic prints may be requested. See Appendix 2 for pricing.

The collection is subdivided into three major categories: *regular-size* photographs, negatives and prints; *oversize* photographs; and *special collections*. *Regular-size* and *oversize* original photographs are arranged by accession number ("P-," followed by the number). Also included with the Photograph Collection are six special collections: The *Heritage Village* Special Photograph Collection; the *Donald Roebling Mansion* Special Photograph Collection; the *Ralph Reed* Special Photograph Collection; the *Lyn Friedt* Special Photograph Collection; the *Sunshine Skyway* Special Photograph Collection; and the *Postcard Collection*, which numbers approximately 3,800 postcards. Photographs are indexed and arranged under the Archive & Library's uniform subject headings. For more details, see the Photographic Collections section later in this *Guide*.

4). AUDIO-VISUAL COLLECTIONS

Audio-Visual Collections cover all “Pinellas Past” (the Pinellas County Government Access Channel’s longest running show) airings from 1984 to present, as well as other videotapes relating to Pinellas County history, Florida history, antiques and collectibles, genealogy, and historic conservation and preservation. “Pinellas Past” tapes are arranged chronologically by show number and are indexed by subject under the uniform subject headings (see Appendix 1). The other videotapes are organized under the uniform subject headings arrangement (see Appendix 1).

The Audio-Visual Collections also include taped *oral histories*, which are arranged alphabetically by name of subject interviewed; *special oral history collections*; and the *slide collection*, which numbers approximately 2,000 slides and is organized under the uniform subject headings.

5). SPECIAL BOOKS & LEDGERS

Special Books and Ledgers are composed of large or oversized materials that because of their size or bulk, are shelved separately in the Archives. They are arranged as follows: *Pinellas County government and municipal governments*, arranged alphabetically. These are followed by *special books and ledgers on other topics*, which are arranged under the uniform subject headings list (see Appendix 1).

6). MAPS and ATLASES

Aerial maps are organized by date, with the earliest map on the top descending downward chronologically to the latest dated aerial on the bottom.

Atlases are arranged in descending order as follows: United States, Southeastern United States; Pinellas County; Sanborn Maps; and Municipal Maps & Atlases.

The Map Collection also includes the *Heritage Village Special Map Collection*, containing maps and blueprints of buildings and structures in the Village.

7). NEWSPAPERS

Newspapers are arranged in three categories: by *bound* volumes; by *loose* (boxed) newspapers; and by *microfilmed* copies. The bound volumes collection is arranged alphabetically by name of paper, followed by the loose newspaper collection, which is also arranged alphabetically. The microfilmed newspapers contain runs of papers.

8). SCRAPBOOKS

The Scrapbook Collection is organized under the uniform subject headings list (see Appendix 1).

9). APPENDICES

The two appendices are designed to provide additional information which may be of interest to the researcher. They are:

- a). *Uniform subject headings list*--contains major headings under which the collection is organized; and
- b). *Research policies*--which provides an overview of rules and guidelines for researchers using the Archives & Library.

ARTS & ENTERTAINMENT:

Clearwater Concert Association
1938-1986

The Clearwater Concert Association organized classical music series for nearly fifty years. The programs featured well-known performers, from violinist Eugen Fodor, cellist Yehuda Hanana, and Soprano Gail Robinson, to the famed Roger Wagner Chorale. The Association first performed in the Clearwater High School Auditorium, then spent two years at the St. Petersburg Junior College Fine Arts Auditorium before it moved to the much larger PACT Auditorium at Ruth Eckerd Hall. Finally, due to a drop in membership and declining ticket sales, expenses could not be met and the group dissolved in 1986.

Pinellas County Vision Cable Community Access (later Time Warner Community Access) was begun by Vision Cable of Pinellas in 1984 as a program to allow for the creation and development of local programming as “an effective tool in helping to entertain, inform, and ultimately, involve you and your neighbors in the activities and issues that affect your community.”

SC-30 was compiled by former Belleair mayor and commissioner Cornelia “Connie” Mudano, who also served as sometimes host and producer of the “Pinellas Past” cable program, sponsored by the Pinellas County Historical Society. The collection includes copies of the Cable Community Access newsletters “Reel to Reel” from 1986 to 2001, as well as related materials and “Pinellas Past” program.

AVIATION & AIRPORTS:

The St. Petersburg/Clearwater International Airport started out as a training center for fighter pilots during World War II. Following the war, the airport was placed under the jurisdiction of Pinellas County, which hoped to make it a regional airport despite competition from nearby Tampa International Airport. Today, the St. Petersburg/Clearwater International Airport continues in operation and has lately seen a rise in both general commercial flights and charters.

SC-2 contains office files from the Airport from 1941 through 1994, as well as construction and audit data for the period October 1, 1950 through July 31, 1956.

BUSINESSES & INDUSTRIES:

The Coachman family was instrumental in the development of Clearwater and Pinellas County. Besides citrus farming, the Coachman family also ran a sawmill that produced lumber for local homes as well as for the Belleview Biltmore in Belleair. The founder of the family in Pinellas, S. S. Coachman, led the fight to separate Pinellas from Hillsborough County and then served as the Chairman of the first Board of County Commissioners for Pinellas County in 1912. The Coachman family was also active in the mercantile, citrus and real estate businesses.

SC-3 contains detailed information on the family's Coachman Properties grove operations and citrus marketing from 1930 to 1979, as well as ledgers, correspondence, estate matters, real estate transaction information, and includes letters of Florida Gov. Millard Caldwell, U.S. Sen. Duncan U. Fletcher and U.S. Rep. Lex Green. The collection also includes three ledgers of E.H. Coachman from the periods 1898, 1905 and 1907.

Arthur C. Turner was one of the pioneers in Clearwater. After his father's (David B. Turner) death in 1869, he opened his first general store on the bay (south of the present Morton Plant Hospital). His biggest store was at the foot of Cleveland Street. He was also served as a postmaster, a charter member of the Methodist Church, County Commissioner of Hillsborough representing the Clearwater area and the first County Treasurer.

SC-32 contains two ledgers of the general store in Clearwater (1873-1875, 1882-1884), West Hillsborough Times advertisements, and subscriptions record (1880s).

Members of the First Congregational Church began gathering as early as 1885. After meeting at a variety of locations in downtown St. Petersburg, the Church was incorporated in 1888 and a permanent home was completed within the next three years. SC-5 contains annual reports from 1911-1961, ledgers, bulletins, and other miscellaneous material relating to the Church.

The First United Methodist Church of Safety Harbor (originally known as the Green Spring Methodist Episcopal Church, South) was originally organized in 1905 by the Florida Conference of the Methodist Episcopal Church South. In 1960, a new church sanctuary was constructed, which replaced the original 1905 structure. In September of 1978, the original church building was moved to Heritage Village, and in 2002, the church officially closed its doors.

SC-31 contains a history of the church, together with photographs, slides, and a scrapbook, newspaper clippings and a notebook of supporting materials. The collection also contains clipping on the "Minnie Yont Coffee Hour" as well as general meeting minutes from 1961 to 1967 and Sylvia Stewart Circle meeting minutes from 1956 to 1991.

The survey divided Clearwater into seven zones which described the significant structures within each zone.

SC-6 contains brief descriptions of surveyed properties, which include photocopied photographs, and information on the date of construction and architectural style of each structure. A small, incomplete selection from the city’s Phase I survey, completed in 1976, is also included in this collection.

Karleen F. DeBlaker is a native of Blackwell, Oklahoma. After graduating from the Oklahoma State University with a B.S. degree in Office Administration and Economics, she moved with her husband to Clearwater in 1961. She soon became actively involved in the community and in 1974 was elected to the Clearwater City Commission, the first woman ever to be so honored. After serving three terms on the city commission, she was elected in 1980 as the first woman to be Clerk of the Circuit Court of Pinellas County. De Blaker has been re-elected Clerk for four consecutive terms and presently serves in that post.

SC-22 contains DeBlaker’s files while a member of the Clearwater City Commission, and includes material on Clearwater annexations, city advisory boards, Clearwater city and Pinellas County charters, downtown redevelopment, economic development, educational programs, election laws, financial management fire and police protection, housing, personnel planning, rent control, utilities, water service and zoning. Also included are extensive files relating to De Blaker’s correspondence from 1974 to 1980, Clearwater City

Commission minutes from 1974 to 1980, the Civic Convention /Cultural Center and material on the Church of Scientology.

Green, Ray E. (1899-1982)

Roy E. Green was born in Manatee County in 1899, and moved with his family to the Pinellas peninsula in 1900. After graduating from Clearwater High School, he became a pharmacist and practiced in Clearwater for 21 years. From 1935 to 1938, Green served as Mayor of Clearwater and in 1938 was appointed Clerk of the Circuit Court for Pinellas County, in which capacity he served for 11 years. In 1949 he became Assistant Comptroller of the State of Florida, and in 1955 became State Comptroller, serving in this office until his retirement in 1965. He died in June 1982 at the age of 82, and is buried at Sylvan Abbey Cemetery.

SC-27 contains a scrapbook and news clippings from the period c.1919 to 1965 relating to Green's political career. Included also are photographs and original letters and telegrams from Senator (and later) Congressman Claude Pepper, Senator Duncan U. Fletcher, Lex Green and J. Hardin Peterson.

Haley, Joan (1900-1989)

Joan Michael Haley was born in Washington, D.C. in 1900. She became an important figure in the world of historic preservation and was involved in the restoration of Old Town in Alexandria, Virginia. Following the death of her husband James Haley, a former Secret Service agent who once served under Presidents Harding and Coolidge, she moved from Washington to Pass-a-Grille in St. Pete Beach. There, she purchased the 1917 Pass-a-Grille Community Church, which became her home and in 1988 she was honored by the Florida Trust for Historic Preservation for her efforts in restoring the old church. On her death in Pass-a-Grille on December 28, 1989, it was her wish that the church be donated to Pinellas County for use as a museum and today the church serves as the Gulf Beaches Historical Museum.

SC-7 contains manuscripts, correspondence and other materials of Joan Haley's father, Helmuth Holler, dating from the 1890's to the 1920's; correspondence, mementos and material from her husband James Haley during his years in the Secret Service; newspaper clippings, receipts and brochures regarding Mrs. Haley's restoration efforts in Virginia and

Pass-a-Grille; and also many photographs, largely unidentified, dating from c. 1890 to the 1940's.

Donald J. Ivey served as Curator of Collections at Heritage Village from 1994 to 2003. During his tenure as Curator, he collected material, researched and wrote biographies on a number of persons which figured prominently in the history of Pinellas County.

McMullen, Chester Bartow Sr. (1902-1953)

Chester B. McMullen, Sr. served in the 82nd Congress as a member of the U.S. House of Representatives from the First District of Florida (January 3, 1951- January 3, 1953). Born in Largo and a resident of Clearwater for most of his life, he was the first Pinellas County native to be elected to the U.S. Congress. Prior to serving in this body, he served as Prosecuting attorney for Pinellas County (1927-1928) and as State attorney for the Sixth Judicial Circuit of Florida (1930-1950).

SC-8 contains correspondence and documents relating to his public service, including Congressional correspondence with constituents, as well as personal business. Included is correspondence from and to McMullen's cousin, Maj. Gen. Clements McMullen, USAF, and J. Hardin Peterson and Courtney Campbell (who respectively preceded and succeeded McMullen in Congress), together with documents signed by Florida Governors John W. Martin and Fred Cone.

McMullen Family

The McMullen family has played a prominent role in the history of the Pinellas peninsula ever since the early 1840's when James P. McMullen came to the area from South Georgia to recover from tuberculosis. Eventually he returned to Georgia and convinced his six brothers to move to Pinellas, saying it was "the closet thing to heaven that you could imagine." Since that time, members of the McMullen family have continued to play an important part in the history and development of Pinellas County.

SC-26 contains copies of genealogical material and other historical documents on the seven McMullen brothers and their sisters and other members of this family line compiled by McMullen descendant and family historian Ann B. Pearson of El Paso, Texas.

Charles E. "Chuck" Rainey was born in Cleveland, Ohio in 1932 and moved to St. Petersburg with his family in 1944. After graduating from the Florida Military Academy in St. Petersburg, he attended Emory University and the University of Florida before being drafted into the Army, where he spent two years during the Korean War. Later, he returned to Pinellas County and worked as an investment counselor. In 1964, he was elected to the Florida House of Representatives where he served until 1967, when he was elected as a Pinellas County Commissioner, a post he held until his retirement in November 1996.

SC-9 contains correspondence, newspaper clippings and other files relating to his service on the Pinellas County Commission from 1968 to 1996, along with personal mementos and other items.

Reed, Ralph (1895-1983)

Ralph David Reed was born in Linton, Indiana in 1895. In 1913, he moved to St. Petersburg with his family and took a job at the *St. Petersburg Times* delivering newspapers and sweeping floors. During the course of the next 46 years, he held a variety of positions at the *Times*, serving as the paper's first fishing columnist, covering City Hall and the County Courthouse, and opening the *Times'* first bureau in Clearwater. After retiring from the *Times* in 1959, he served as the first director of the Pinellas County Historical Museum from 1961 to 1975. The museum's collection, originally located in the basement of the old County Courthouse in Clearwater, later formed the basis for the collection at Heritage Village.

SC-10 contains correspondence and research files relating to Reed's service as museum director from 1961 to 1975, and miscellaneous writings.

Roebing, Donald (1909-1959)

Donald Roebing was born in New York City on November 15, 1909 and died in Boston, Massachusetts on August 29, 1959. He was the great-grandson of John Augustus Roebing, who designed the Brooklyn Bridge and a grandson of Washington Augustus Roebing, who directed the construction of the bridge. Donald himself was a talented engineer and he developed the amphibious vehicle the "Alligator" and the LVT (Landing Vehicle, Tracked), both of which were widely used by U.S. forces in World War II. A resident of Pinellas County since the 1920's, Roebing was also known as a generous philanthropist. He supported various local causes, including Morton Plant Hospital and Peace Memorial Presbyterian Church in Clearwater.

SC-11 contains a variety of personal mementos of Donald Roebing, photographs, family papers, certificates and awards, including material relating to the "Alligator" and various other Roebing-designed amphibious vehicles. The collection also includes a set of abstracts of title and other documents relating to the Donald Roebing Estate "Spottswood" in Clearwater, now on the National Register of Historic Places.

Straub, William L. (1867-1939)

Born in Dowagiac, Michigan on July 14, 1867, William L. Straub arrived in Pinellas County in 1900. As editor and publisher of the *St. Petersburg Times*, he led the successful fight to “secede” Pinellas from Hillsborough County in 1911 and later (in 1929) wrote the book *History of Pinellas County, Florida*, considered by many to be the finest history yet written on the area.

SC-12 contains Straub’s clip file, which includes portrait images of Pinellas and Florida notables taken from photographs, newspapers and magazine cutouts. The collection also includes an original manuscript and photocopy of his “Saga Of Dakota Pioneering Days,” an unpublished work relating to his early career in the Dakota Territory.

Wells, Harvey L. (c. 1907-1968)

Harvey L. Wells was a member of the Pinellas County Historical Commission and an avid genealogist who conducted extensive research on early Florida and Pinellas pioneers, with an emphasis on those who came to Florida under the Armed Occupation Act of 1842.

SC-13 contains detailed correspondence and genealogical data on early Pinellas settlers, including census records from 1840 to 1870. The collection also includes extensive research files on early Pinellas pioneer Odet Philippe and various Pinellas pioneer families.

Jefferson Alexander “Alec” White was born in St. Augustine, Florida in 1899. At an early age, he moved to the Tampa Bay area and graduated from high school in Hillsborough County. In 1925, he married Lucy Mason McMullen, daughter of Dr. Robert Lee “Dr. Bob” McMullen and granddaughter of Largo pioneer Daniel McMullen.

SC-28 contains 28 volumes of genealogical data collected by White and his father-in-law Dr. Robert McMullen relating to the early McMullen, White and Hull families. Also included is an index (one volume), together with an index card file of research contacts and resources.

The Pinellas County Veterans Collection comprises material compiled and donated to Heritage Village by Florida military historian Robert Hawk. The collection encompasses basic information on all residents who served in the Armed Forces from Pinellas County from the Spanish-American War through World War II.

The Pinellas County Guards were comprised of four local companies of the Florida National Guard that were organized in 1917 by *St. Petersburg Independent* editor Lew Brown, in response to President Woodrow Wilson's call on the states to establish a system of county guards to perform local active duty service during World War I. During World War II, the "Clearwater Roll of Honor" was compiled from 1943 to 1944 in an attempt to record all those individuals from the Clearwater area serving in the U.S. Armed Forces.

SC-18 contains compiled index cards on the Pinellas County Guards giving basic enlistment and personal data including date and place of enlistment, age, occupation and home address; and compiled index cards of the Clearwater Roll of Honor giving basic service data on area residents, including name, branch of service, registrant, and date of registration.

In December of 1999, through a grant provided by the Pinellas County Department of Community Development to the Pinellas County Historical Society, a project was undertaken to begin the systematic collection of materials that will help document the history of the African American community in Pinellas County. Initially, North Pinellas County was the focus of the project and specifically, six major communities were targeted for study: Clearwater, Dunedin, Largo, Oldsmar, Safety Harbor and Tarpon Springs. Subsequently, the scope of the project was expanded to include all of Pinellas County.

Fort DeSoto sits amid 884 acres on Mullet Key, an area which was originally selected by Robert E. Lee as an ideal location for a coastal defense site during the 1840's. Construction of Fort DeSoto began in 1898 and was completed in 1900, and for most of its active service it was used as a training base for U.S. artillery forces. Abandoned in 1920, it was purchased from the U.S. Government by Pinellas County on October 6, 1938 for the sum of \$18,000.00. During World War II, the fort served as a satellite of MacDill Field (now MacDill Air Force Base) in Tampa, and was used for gunnery and bombing target training and as an Air-Sea rescue base. In 1948, the county resumed ownership of the property and finally, on May 11, 1963, it was opened to the public as a Pinellas County Park.

SC-19 consists of photocopied records of Fort DeSoto detailing armaments, buildings and records of inspections dating from 1898 to 1940.

The site of the present City of Oldsmar consisting of fifty-eight square miles of land was purchased by Ransom E. Olds in 1916 with the intent of establishing a town. Olds invested heavily in providing the infrastructure of what he envisioned as a model farming-industrial community. In the early 1920's Olds sold all of his holdings in Oldsmar. The town's name was changed to Tampashores and it was incorporated in 1926. In later years the town's name reverted back to Oldsmar.

 - Xerox copies = 10 cents each.
 - Plain Paper Color Copies= \$4 each for Pinellas County Historical Society members; \$5 each for non-members.
 - Scanned images = \$10 per image. Depending on the quantity and quality of scans, turnaround time is within 2 to 3 weeks.
 - All copies are to be paid for in advance. Checks or money orders should be made payable to Pinellas County Historical Society or PCHS. Cash is also accepted. No credit cards please. Allow 2 to 3 weeks for completion of your order. We do not loan out original materials for duplication.
