The Pinellas County Health Program is the place you can go for primary care and other medical services.

The Pinellas County Health Program provides quality health care services for uninsured residents ages 18 to 64 who are not eligible for Medicaid, Medicare or other public assistance programs and have an income at or below 100 percent of the Federal Poverty Level. Participants are served in a medical home at one of five participating Florida Health Department of Pinellas County locations.

What the program covers

- Primary care physician visits at your selected medical home
- Referrals to specialty physicians and other providers
- Wellness and prevention services including annual physicals and nutrition education
- Behavioral health screening
- Chronic disease management
- Cancer screening
- Pharmacy services
- Limited dental services
- Laboratory services

Case management referral services are available to assist patients dealing with:

Taking care of yourself

Good nutrition, preventive care and a healthy lifestyle are an essential combination that contributes to improved overall health.

Participants in the Pinellas County Health Program have access to case managers during their enrollment period who develop individualized case plans and provide information on maintaining good habits and referrals to other services.

Taking care of yourself now and developing long-term wellness routines may increase longevity and enhance your quality of life.



Required paperwork

① Social Security card* and one other form of ID such as:

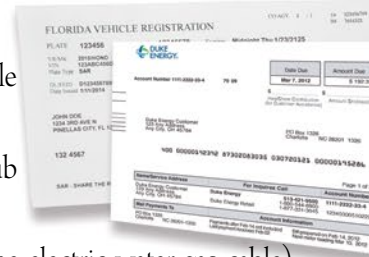
- Birth certificate
- Employment records
- Florida or student ID
- U.S. Passport
- Valid driver license
- Voter registration card
- Work ID or badge
- Mortgage or lease agreement

*If you do not have a Social Security card, bring proof of an application for a new card.



② Proof of Pinellas County residency such as:

- Bank statements for past two months
- Employment record
- Vehicle registration or title
- School record
- Current pay check or stub
- Rent receipt
- Current Utility bill (phone, electric, water, gas, cable)



③ Proof of legal citizenship or immigration if born outside the United States such as:

- Birth certificate
- U. S. Naturalization papers
- Permanent Resident card

④ Proof of income for the past 30 days such as:

- Award letters from Social Security Administration or Veterans Administration
- Pay stubs
- Child support/alimony
- Unemployment insurance benefits
- Workers' compensation
