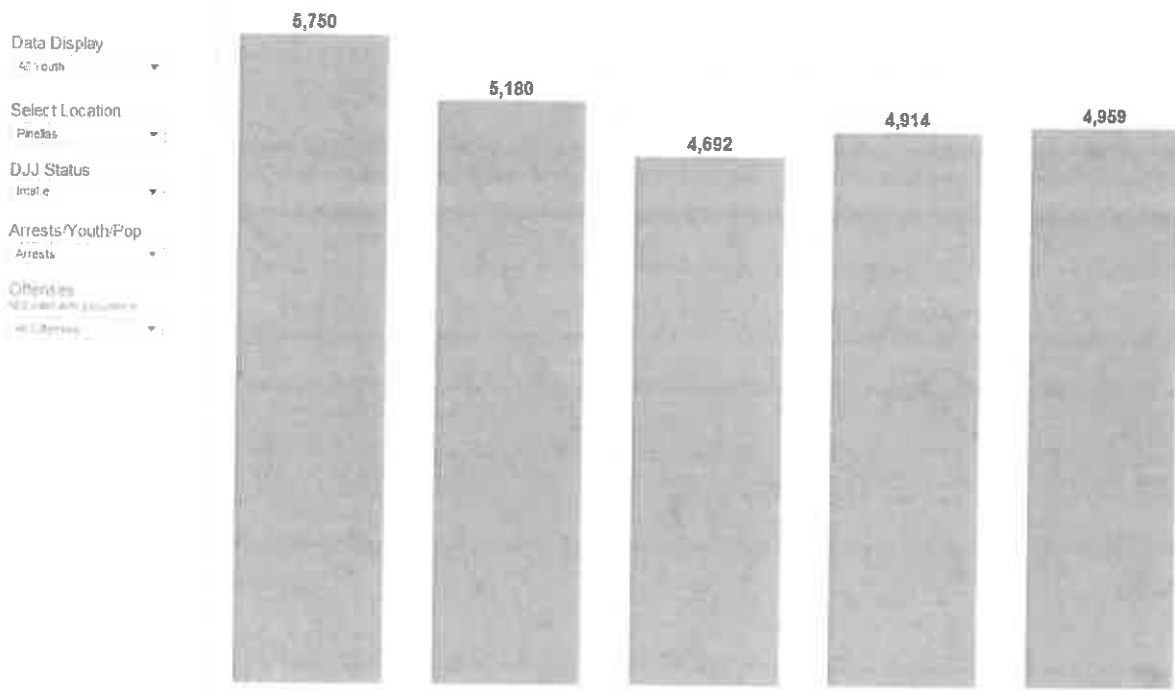

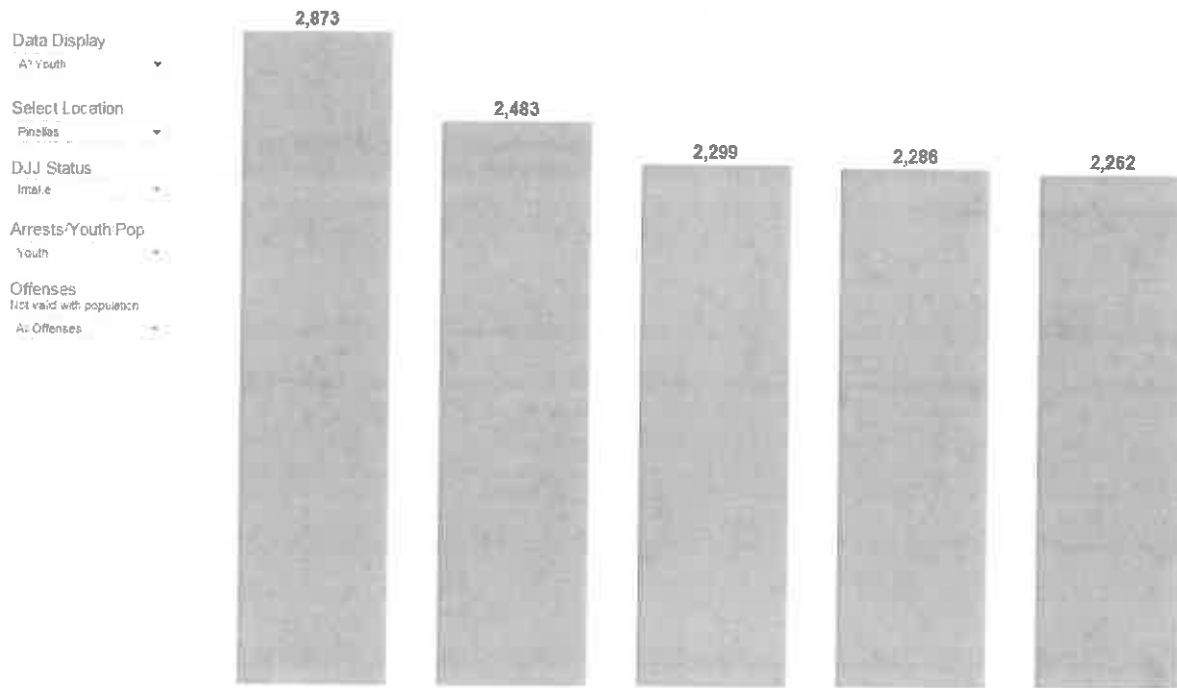

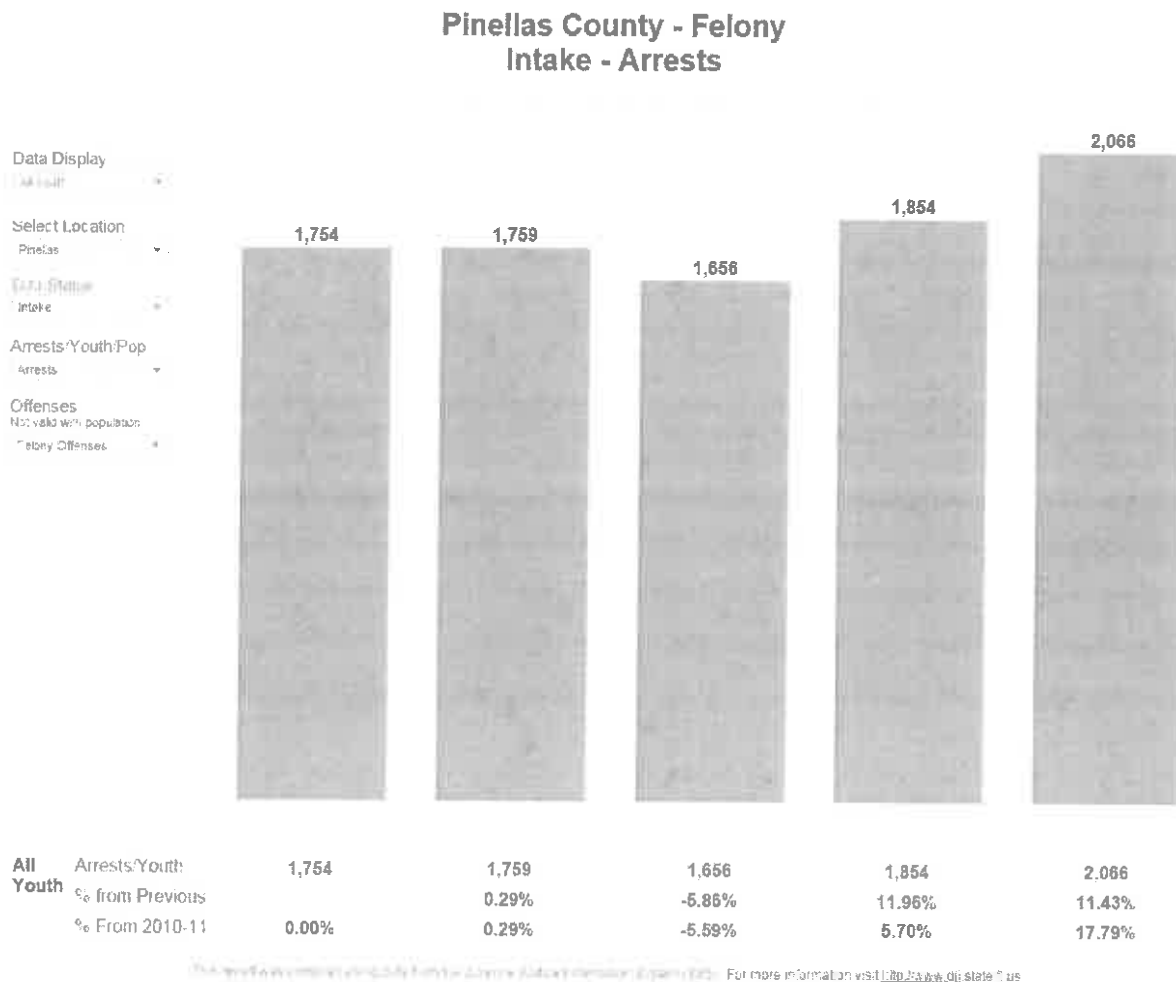

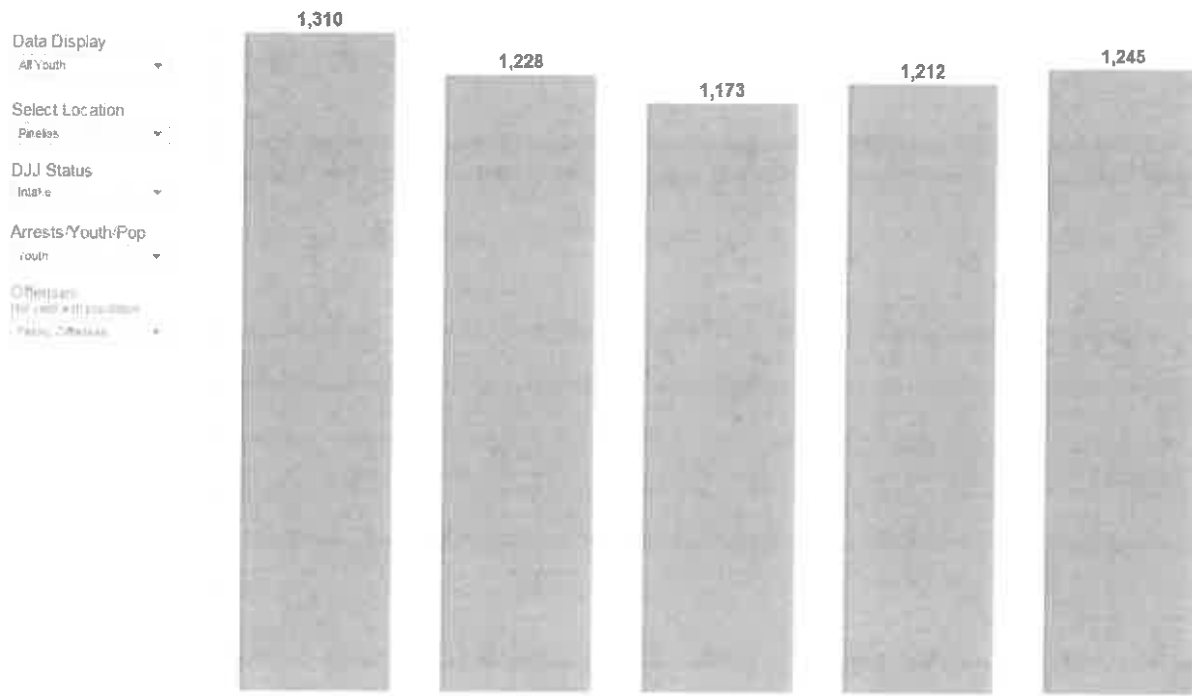

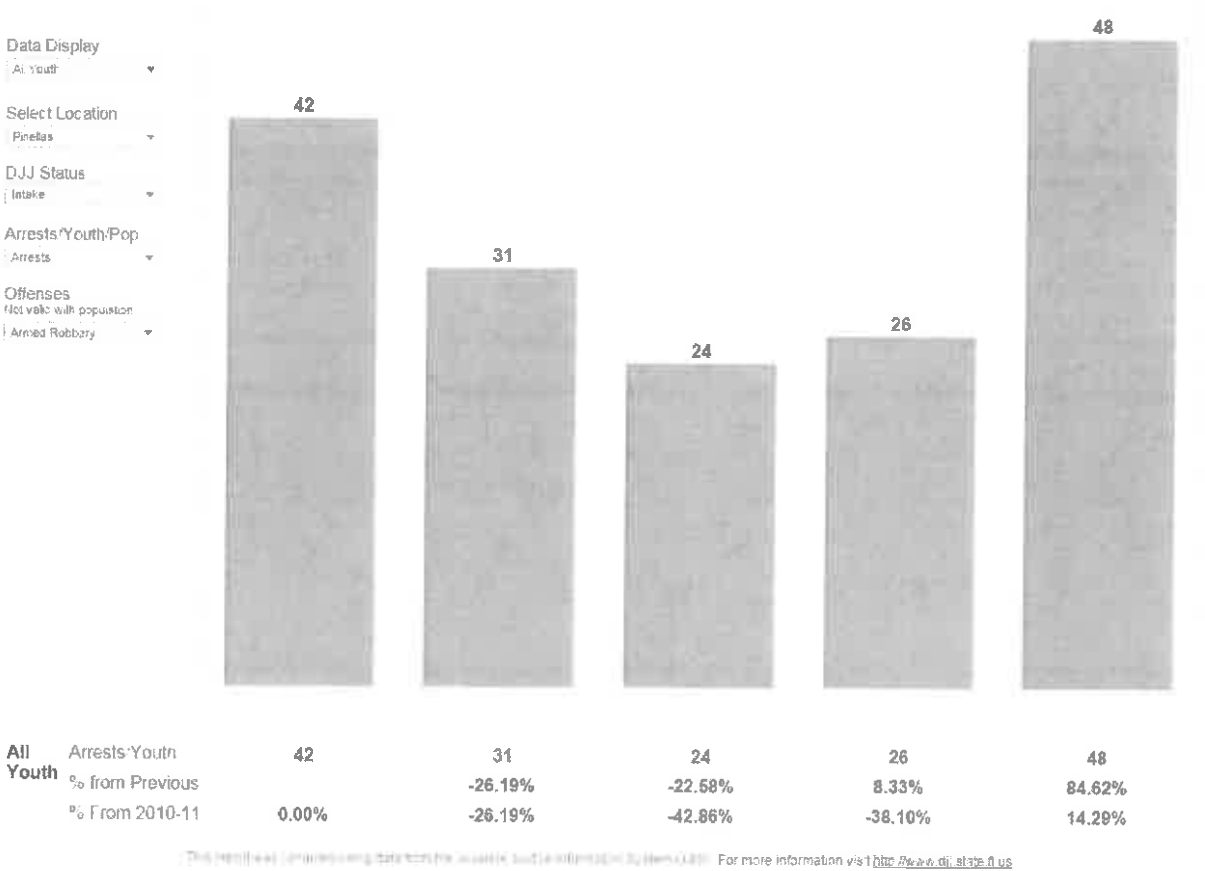
Pinellas County - Armed Robbery Intake - Youth

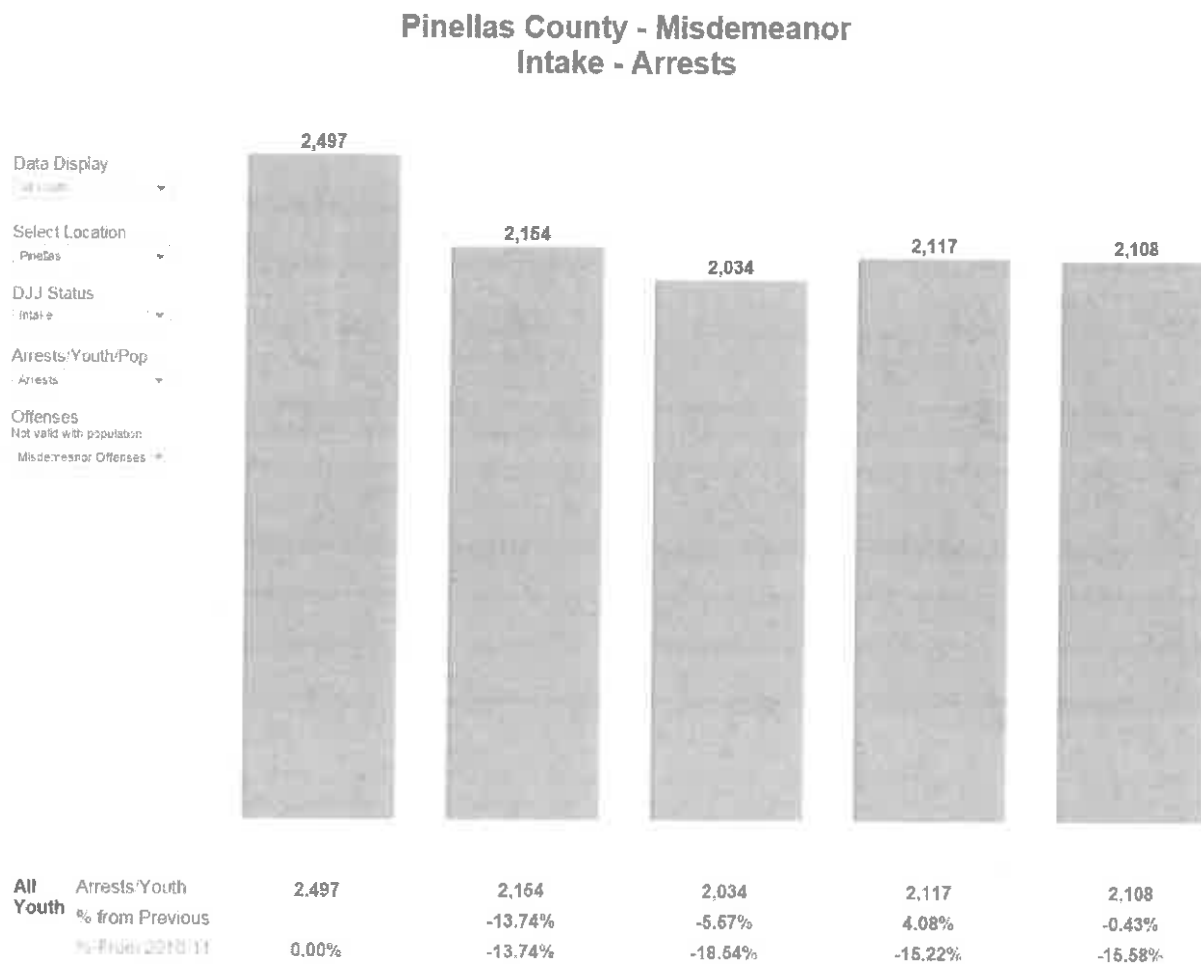
Pinellas County - Armed Robbery Intake - Arrests



Pinellas County MISDEMEANOR Arrest Data

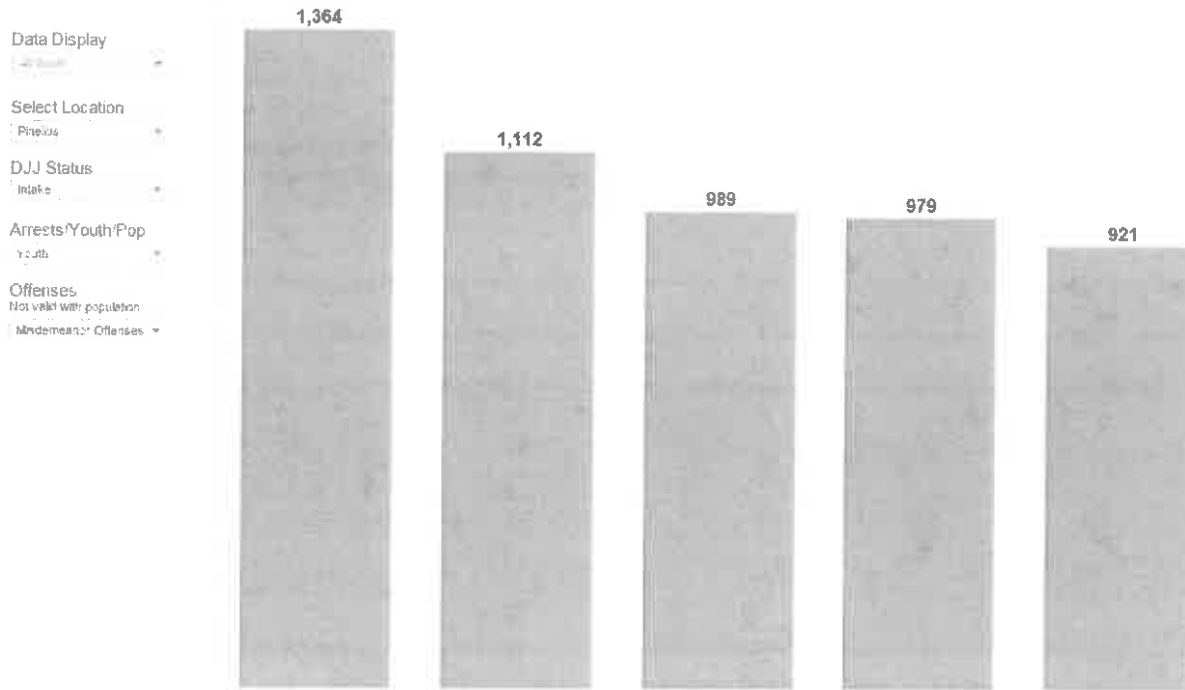

Pinellas County - Misdemeanor Intake - Youth



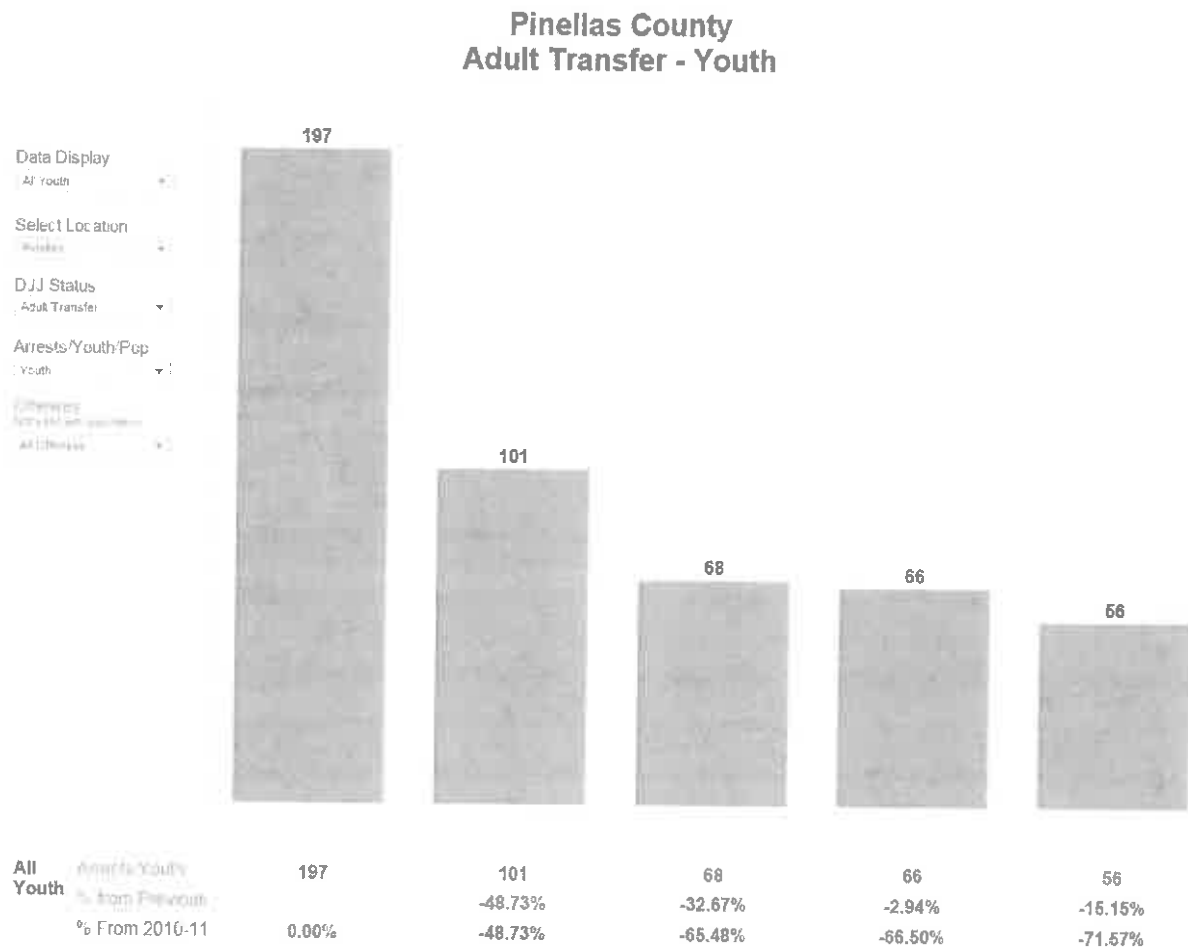

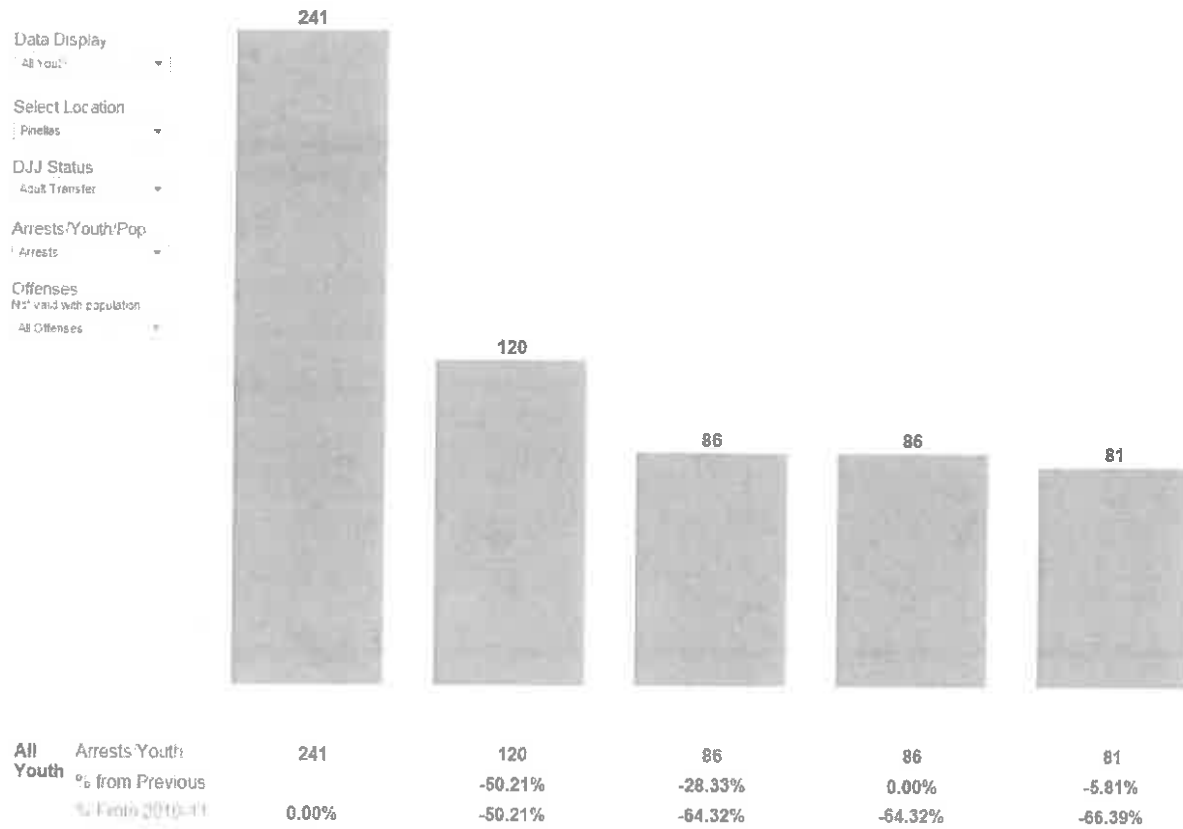
ADULT TRANSFER

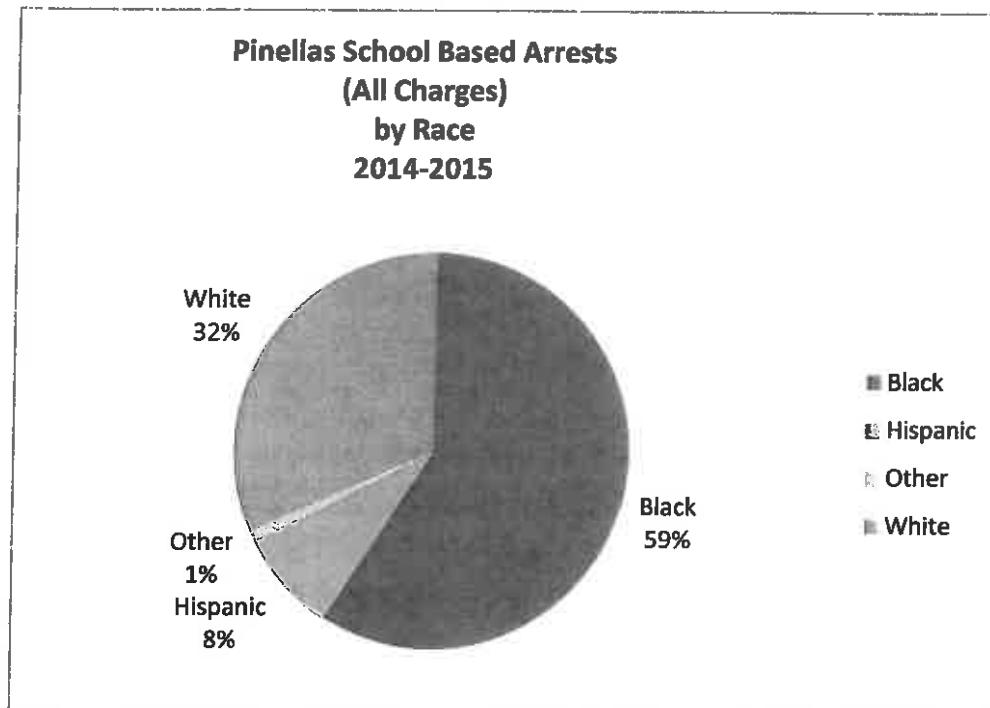

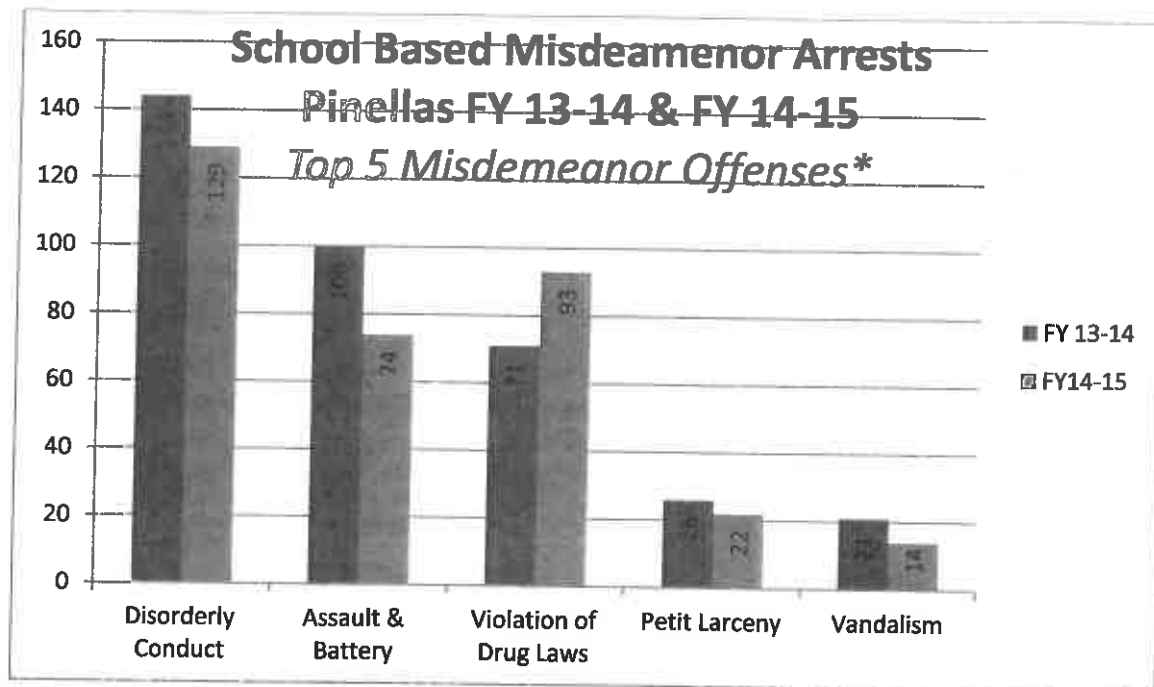

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HOW THE FLORIDA DEPARTMENT OF JUVENILE JUSTICE TRACKS AND REPORTS DELINQUENCY IN SCHOOLS

The Department of Juvenile Justice (DJJ) monitors the number of youth arrests received for delinquent offenses that were identified as occurring on school grounds, a school bus (or bus stop), or at an official school event. Generally, the information is provided to the Department by law enforcement as part of the delinquency intake process and is recorded in the Department's Juvenile Justice Information System (JJIS). This information is then extracted from JJIS and reported to the public annually through the Department's "Delinquency in Florida's Schools" analysis. For this report only Felony and Misdemeanor offenses are included. "Other" offenses such as Violations of Probation and court related charges are not included among this report's arrest counts in order that school related arrests and community arrests may be compared. No dispositions, charge reductions or upgrades are included in this report as it is a profile of offenses recorded during the intake process.

WHAT IS SCHOOL ARREST RATE?

The school related arrest rate is simply the number of school related arrests per 1,000 student population for the geographic area being examined. School Population Source: Florida Department of Education, 2014-15 Survey 2 Data. Population of schools (excludes lab.) grades 6-12 during the 2014-15 school year.

WHO ARRESTS YOUTH FOR DELINQUENCY IN SCHOOLS?

With few exceptions, local law enforcement (police officers and sheriff's deputies) are responsible for arresting youth for alleged acts of delinquency in school. In many communities, local police officers or sheriff's deputies serve as school resource officers and are based at the school. These school resource officers may be a part of an existing law enforcement agency or, in some communities, may make up their own distinctive law enforcement entity.

WHAT AFFECTS SCHOOL ARREST AND ARREST RATES?

Numerous factors influence whether or not a youth is arrested for delinquency in school. Each school district in Florida maintains its own distinctive progressive response or "discipline" plan that outlines how misbehavior to actual crimes should be handled. In addition, law enforcement agencies in each school district have their own policies regarding how to respond to delinquency in schools. The availability and use of alternatives to arrest may have a substantial impact on the number of youth referred to the Department of Juvenile Justice. For example, three of the state's largest school districts (Miami-Dade, Broward and Palm Beach) aggressively employ alternatives to arrests, and these districts subsequently have school arrests rates much lower than the general statewide average.

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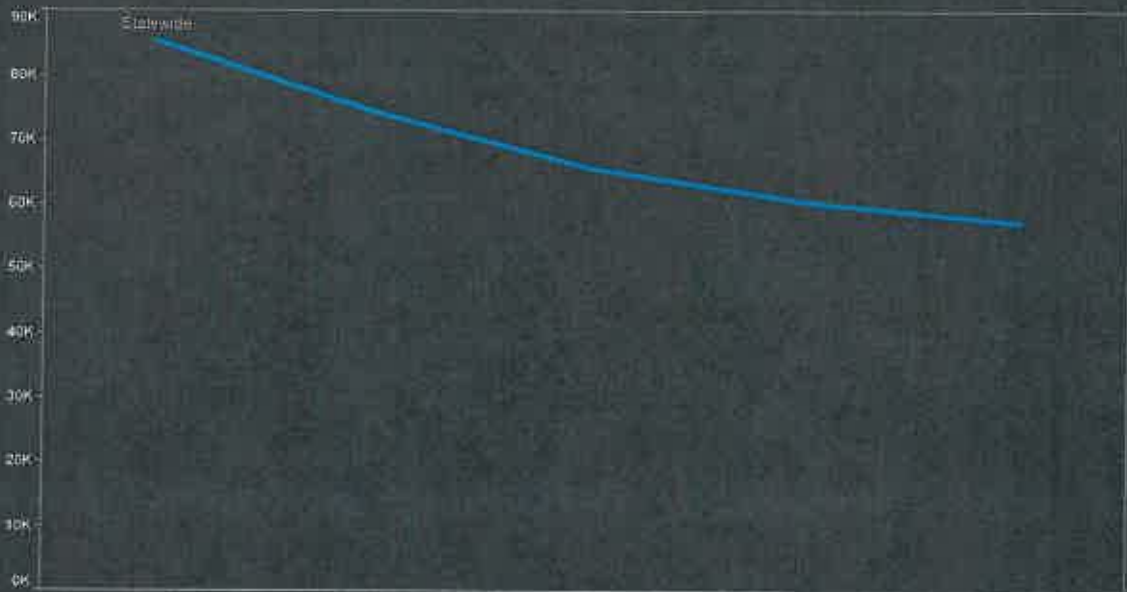

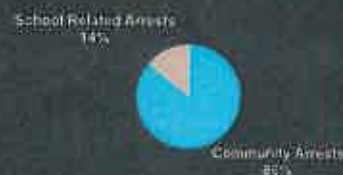

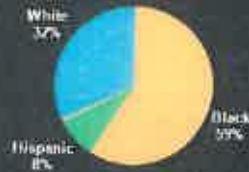
