1. 1 County, 1 System for 24 Cities. 18 Fire Departments and 1 Ambulance provider in Pinellas
2. County.
3. Supported by: EMS is supported by funds generated by the Countywide EMS Ad Valorem
4. Millage and Ambulance User Fees.
5. Providing Responses: The system provides responses to an average of 655 EMS calls per day.
6. Graphic of a citizen calling 9-1-1 for emergency assistance.
7. Graphic of a 9-1-1 operator taking the call and sending it out.

9. 238,931 EMS responses in fiscal year 2020 - 2021.
 - a. 186,782 Emergency Responses where both an ambulance and a fire truck were needed.
 - b. 52,149 Non-Emergency Responses where only an ambulance was needed.
 - c. 184,664 Patient Transports in an ambulance to either a care facility or hospital
 - d. 92.17% of the response times within 7.5 minutes (4 minutes 36 seconds average).

12. 9. Response Distribution:
 - a. Sick Person – 37.45%
 - b. Traffic Accidents – 6.87%
 - c. Falls – 14.04%
 - d. Breathing Problem – 6.59%
 - e. Cardiac Chest Pain – 4.57%
 - f. Others – 30.48%
