

Pinellas #2 Reef This deep-water site is home to multiple vessels, and a pile of culverts considered by divers as West Central Florida's best wreck dive site. Grouper, snapper, amberjack, jack crevelle, spanish mackerel, triggerfish, barracuda and an occasional shark are often found here.

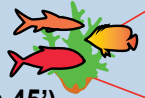
