How Do I Get Rid Of It?

Fees for Business Waste

Fees are charged to eligible businesses, including non-profits and religious organizations, haulers, hobbyists, property managers and salvagers, for the disposal of non-household waste at a Pinellas County [mobile collection](#) or a monthly [EnviroBusiness Day](#).

It is illegal for businesses to put hazardous electronics and chemicals in the regular trash.

For more information on what qualifies as a hazardous waste and an eligible business, visit the Pinellas County Small Quantity Generator (SQG) Program's [website](#).

Type of Chemical	Examples	Fee
Aerosols	air freshener, bug spray, WD-40, spray paint	\$1.38 per pound
Antifreeze*	antifreeze from a vehicle	\$1.45 per pound
Batteries	lithium, lithium-ion, button cell & rechargeable	\$1.57 per pound
Chlorinated/Halogenated Chemicals	methylene chloride, chloroform	\$0.76 per pound
Corrosives	drain cleaner, lye, muriatic acid, naval jelly	\$0.70 per pound
Cyanides/Sulfides	potassium cyanide, carbon disulfide	\$6.36 per pound
Flammables – liquid	acetone, ethanol, gasoline, lighter fluid, mineral spirits, automotive fluids (steering, transmission,	\$0.76 per pound

Flammables – solid	roofing tar	\$1.31 per pound
Float Switches	water pump control used for wells or boats	\$2.46 per pound
Fluorescent bulbs – tubes	energy-efficient lighting tube (contains mercury)	\$0.33 per foot
Fluorescent bulbs – CFLs	compact fluorescent lamp (contains mercury)	\$0.33 per bulb
High Intensity Device (HID) Lamps/Mercury Bulbs	HID devices such as HID bulbs	\$5.64 per pound
Mercury & Mercury-Containing Devices	mercury in liquid form, thermostat, thermometer (contains mercury)	\$2.46 per pound
Oxidizers	fertilizer, stump removers	\$4.63 per pound
Paint – latex*	water-based: latex, vinyl, or acrylic paint	\$0.37 per pound
Paint – oil-based*	oil-based: alkyd, polyurethane, or varnish paint	\$0.90 per pound
PCB Ballasts	fluorescent lamp ballasts (not bulbs)	\$0.97 per pound
Poisons	creosote, herbicides, pesticides, or amines	\$1.45 per pound
Reactives	ethers, peroxides, calcium carbide, flares	\$6.36 per pound
Smoke Detectors		\$3.01 per pound
Used oil*	motor oil from a vehicle	\$0.76 per pound
