What to bring:

Chemicals: automotive fluids, cleaners, fertilizers, fluorescent bulbs and other mercury containing devices, fungicides, herbicides, household batteries, paint (latex or oil), paint remover, paint thinner, pesticides, pool chemicals, solvents, smoke detectors, used motor oil, vehicle batteries, wood preservatives

Electronics: TVs, VCRs, cell phones, computers, copiers, digital cameras, fax machines, microwave ovens, monitors, printers, printer cartridges, stereo equipment, telephones, etc.

What **NOT** to bring:

appliances, biological or infectious waste, empty paint cans, explosives, fire extinguishers, garbage, propane tanks, radioactive waste

How to Package & Transport Chemicals

- (1) Do NOT mix chemicals together.
- (2) Keep products in original labeled containers if possible.
- (3) Place containers into cardboard boxes. Use crumpled newspaper in boxes to prevent breakage.
- (4) Place leaky containers in CLEAR plastic bags and transport in boxes with newspaper.
- (5) Put boxes in the trunk or in back of vehicle away from passengers.
- (6) Place individual batteries in separate plastic bags or cover terminals with heavy tape to prevent short circuits.
