- Take the stress (and waste) out of holiday shopping with **eco-friendly gifts** such as:
 - **gift certificates, event tickets, or gift cards**
 - **gifts of time** such as six months of lawn-mowing for Dad or a homemade dinner for Aunt Sue
 - **investment gifts** such as savings bonds or college plans
- Select **durable gifts** with a long life.
- Buy **rechargeable batteries** instead of disposable. Almost half of all battery sales are for electronic holiday gifts!
- Buy gifts with **minimal packaging**.
- **Make your own cards and gift tags** instead of buying. You don't need an art degree; just express yourself!
- Save energy when holiday shopping by **walking, car pooling, riding your bike, or shopping online**.
- **Cancel catalogs** you don't need with a quick phone call (see [Junk Mail Reduction Kit](#)).
- **Let your LED lights shine.** LED's use 75% less energy than conventional holiday lights and last up to ten times longer.
- **Don't wrap oversized packages.** Hide them and leave clues like a treasure hunt.

Rekindle the holiday spirit of giving by reusing as much as possible.

Lavish gift-buying and glittery garnishings not only cost American consumers thousands of dollars a year, but also cost trees, water, energy and landfill space. Here are some tips for REUSE during the holidays:

reuse

- **Reuse wrapping materials.** When it comes to ribbons, bows, and gift bags—it's okay to be a pack rat! Keep these items to reuse for future gifts.
- **Reuse packing materials** such as cardboard boxes and packing peanuts for mailing gifts. Instead of buying packing materials, use crumpled plastic grocery bags or newspaper.
- **Cut up old greeting cards** for gift tags or [recycled ornaments](#).
- Give back to the Earth by planting your Christmas tree or **reusing** an artificial one.
- Give back to the community by **donating unwanted items** to local charities ([list](#)). Encourage your children to go through their toys and clothes before the holidays to pick items to donate.
- **Bag it.** When shopping, instead of accepting a new bag at each store, reuse the largest bag or bring your own durable bag.
- Make your guests feel special (and reduce waste) by **avoiding throwaway tableware and linens** such as plastic utensils or paper tablecloths.

'Tis the season to be jolly, and you'll enjoy the holidays even more if you know you're helping the environment. Here are some tips to RECYCLE your holiday waste:

- **Recycle your Christmas tree** ([local programs](#)). Goodbye Yuletide tree, hello Yuletide mulch—your tree will be recycled into mulch provided free to the public ([free mulch sites](#)).
- **Recycle used gift wrap, tissue paper, greeting cards, and gift boxes** (any dry paper that tears) with "mixed paper" at [curbside or drop-off recycling](#).
- Make room for new electronics by **recycling your old TV, cell phone, computer, etc.** at [HEC3](#).
- **Buy items with recycled content** such as greeting cards or wrapping paper.
- **Shred used wrapping paper** to use as filler in gift bags or packages.
- **Recycle holiday decorations** such as pumpkins or berries or **leftover food** by [composting](#).
