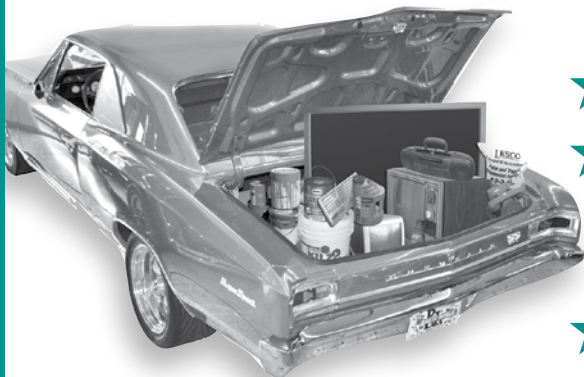

Household Electronics & Chemical Collection

➡ What to bring

Chemicals: Automotive fluids, batteries (*household or vehicle*), cleaners, cooking oil, fertilizers, fluorescent bulbs and other mercury containing devices, fuels (*i.e. gasoline, kerosene*), fungicides, herbicides, insecticides, motor oil, paint (*latex or oil*), paint remover, paint thinner, pesticides, pool chemicals, smoke detectors, solvents, wood preservatives.

Electronics: Camcorders, CD players, cell phones or smartphones, computers and/or peripherals, copiers, digital cameras, DVD players, fax machines, GPS units, marine depth finders, microwave ovens, pagers, portable players (*i.e. MP3, iPod*), printer or toner cartridges, radios, stereo equipment, telephones, TVs, VCRs, video game players.

🚫 What NOT to bring

Appliances, biological or infectious waste, empty paint cans, explosives, fire extinguishers, garbage, gas cylinders larger than one pound (*i.e. propane tanks*), medicine, radioactive waste, tires.

How to Package & Transport Chemicals

- (1) Do NOT mix chemicals together.
- (2) Keep products in original labeled containers if possible.
- (3) Place containers into cardboard boxes. Use crumpled newspaper in boxes to prevent breakage.
- (4) Place leaky containers in CLEAR plastic bags and transport in boxes with newspaper.
- (5) Put boxes in the trunk or in back of vehicle away from passengers.
- (6) Place individual batteries in separate plastic bags or cover terminals with heavy tape to prevent short circuits.
