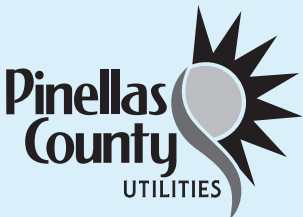

WHAT.....

Pinellas County Utilities will conduct a **routine maintenance program** on the water system in order to optimize water quality. The method of water treatment will be temporarily changed from chloramines to chlorine disinfection.

WHEN.....

September 18, 2006 - October 27, 2006

WHO.....

This change will affect all Pinellas County Utilities water customers, as well as the water customers of Clearwater, Pinellas Park, Safety Harbor, Tarpon Springs and parts of Oldsmar.

WHY.....

Utilities using chloramine for water disinfection routinely switch to chlorine annually for a short period in order to maintain system integrity.

RESULT.....

Customers will not experience low pressure or disruption of service. **The only noticeable change may be a slight difference in the taste and/or odor of the water. The water will be perfectly safe to drink.**

SPECIAL NEEDS.....

Kidney dialysis patients should not be impacted, but should contact their dialysis care provider for more information about chlorine treatment. Fish owners should not be affected if they already have a system in place to remove chloramines, but they should contact local pet suppliers with any questions.
