### Batteries - alkaline

*single-use household batteries*

\* Mercury has been eliminated from alkaline batteries so they may be safely disposed in the trash. However, never dispose of batteries in a fire because they could explode. For more information, view the [Homeowner's Guide to Batteries](#) (2.2 MB pdf)

1. **Reduce** waste by substituting rechargeable batteries.
2. **Drop off** at a Pinellas County [mobile collection](#) or the [HEC<sub>3</sub> facility](#) for recycling (free for residents). To prevent short-circuits, please cover terminals with heavy tape or place individual batteries in separate plastic bags.
3. **Recycle** PerfPower™ Go Green batteries. Register at [iRecycled.com](http://iRecycled.com), and enter the battery package code after each purchase. Each type of battery correlates to a certain number of points; e.g., AA batteries are 1 point and D are 6 points. When you reach 75 points, print a free shipping label to mail batteries for free recycling. This program is for Go Green brand alkaline batteries only.
4. **Drop off** at a battery store for recycling. The following stores accept alkaline batteries (no charge):

5. **Drop off** at [OC Management](#), 200 Tower Dr., Suite C, Oldsmar M-F 9am-4pm for free recycling (813-855-2233).
6. **Recycle** using a mail-in program (fee varies), such as:

7. **Dispose.** Although it is safe to dispose alkaline batteries in the trash, it's better to recycle them or replace them with rechargeable batteries if possible.
