CURBSIDE RECYCLING

- aluminum cans
- cardboard (flattened)
- glass (all colors)
- metal jar lids
- mixed paper
- newspapers
- plastic bottles

YARD WASTE RECYCLING

Collected on Wednesdays. Place loose waste in a container. You can pile larger brush at the curb, but it cannot exceed 4 feet in length or 6 inches in diameter. **No bags.**

RECYCLING GUIDELINES

No plastic bags please!

Aluminum Cans – Empty aluminum cans used for drinks or food. Rinse and crush if possible.

Cardboard – Clean, empty, dry corrugated (3-layer) cardboard boxes or packaging. Please flatten boxes. Pizza boxes okay if no food or grease. If the bottom is greasy, tear it off and recycle the clean lid only. **(NEW!)**

Glass Bottles and Jars – Empty glass bottles or jars (all colors). Labels okay. No caps or lids.

Metal Jar Lids – Metal screw lids (tops) from glass containers, such as beer bottle caps.

Mixed Paper – Any clean, dry paper item that tears, such as white or colored paper, shredded paper, office paper, magazines, catalogs, phone books, junk mail, envelopes, wrapping paper, or paperboard items such as cereal boxes. No paper towels or tissues.

Newspapers – Clean and dry newspapers (including inserts). No string or twine. It's okay to put the newspapers inside a paper bag.

Phone Books – Recycle with mixed paper. Remove plastic wrap, bag, or magnets.

Plastic Bottles – Empty bottles such as water, soda or mouthwash bottles. Rinse and crush if possible. No need to check for a number—just “check for a neck” (i.e., an opening smaller than the base). Bottles only; no tubs, cups or bags. Labels okay. Caps okay but remove the cap from the bottle so that liquids dry out. Place the cap and the bottle in the bin. **(NEW!)**

Steel (Tin) Cans – Empty steel cans used for food such as soup or vegetable cans. Labels and lids okay. No aerosol cans or paint cans. Rinse if possible.
