YARD WASTE RECYCLING:

Curbside: Use bags, bundles, or containers not exceeding 50 lbs. Branches cannot exceed 4 in. diameter or 4 ft. length. No loose piles.

Drop off: All yard waste is accepted. A fee is charged. Residents must bring a current utility bill and driver's license.

RECYCLING GUIDELINES

NO PLASTIC BAGS PLEASE!

Aluminum Cans – Any empty aluminum can such as soda or juice cans. Rinse and crush if possible.

Cardboard – Clean, empty, dry corrugated (3-layer) cardboard boxes or packaging. Please flatten boxes. No pizza boxes.

Glass Bottles & Jars – Any empty glass jar or bottle (all colors). Labels okay. No caps or lids.

Milk & Juice Cartons – Any empty gable-top beverage container such as milk, half and half, or orange juice cartons. Rinse and crush if possible. At the drop-off recycling sites, please put cartons in the plastic bottles recycling bin, not the cardboard bin.

Newspapers – Dry newspapers and inserts. No string or twine. It's okay to put inside a paper bag.

Plastic Bottles – Any empty plastic bottle with a “neck” (opening smaller than the base) such as water, soda, shampoo, or ketchup. No need to check for #1 or #2—just “check for a neck”. Bottles only; no tubs, cups, or bags. Labels okay. No caps or lids. Rinse and crush if possible.

Steel (Tin) Cans – Any empty steel cans such as soup cans. Labels and lids okay. Rinse if possible.
