Gratitude for Our Volunteers

We are grateful for your benevolence all year round. And you sure are generous people! In fiscal year 2016 (October 1, 2015 through September 30, 2016) Pinellas County government volunteers donated over **231,000 hours**! That's almost 29,000 full time work days.

Which departments saw the most volunteers? You guessed it: most of your time was spent maintaining or enhancing our parks and natural places, and helping to care for our homeless dogs and cats. You might be surprised at some of the other departments that have benefited from your kindness.

Volunteers donated over 2,700 hours at the St. Pete/Clearwater Airport, welcoming guests to our larger community. The Clerk of the Circuit Court was favored with over 2,500 volunteer hours. Over 12,000 hours were donated at Mosquito Control assisting with the battle against the Zika virus. Over 14,000 hours were donated at Emergency Management during an unpredictable hurricane season.

Did you know the [Gulf Beaches Historical Museum](#) (GBHM) in the national historic district of Pass-A-Grille, St. Pete Beach, is staffed entirely by volunteers?

Formerly a church, the building was purchased by Joan Haley to save it from the wrecking ball. Upon her passing, she left the building to Pinellas County to use as a museum.

2017 is the 100th anniversary of the building of the church/museum. It is also the 60th anniversary of the consolidation which created the City of St Pete

Beach. GBHM is partnering with the City in staging an Island Festival and celebrating both anniversaries on March 4th. On hand will be the MG

Car Club, bands, vendors, food, and beer and wine trucks. They are looking for people to work inside and outside the museum during the event.
