

2021 Wellness Incentive: Preventive Screening

1. Rewards are available for ONE preventive screening.
2. Choose one: colonoscopy, pap test, or mammogram.
3. Earn up to 12,500 reward points or \$50 cash.
4. Once the claim is processed by UnitedHealthcare, you can view the completion in Rally.
5. The incentive will be rewarded at the next [semi-annual payout](#).

Which preventive screenings qualify?

Doctor-recommended preventive screenings are vital for early detection and treatment of medical conditions. You can get any screening for which you are eligible, but you will receive an incentive for only one per year (colonoscopy or pap test or mammogram). Annual physicals are highly encouraged but are not incentivized.



What are the age requirements for preventive screenings?

To earn rewards for a preventive screening, you must be:

- Colonoscopy - age 45 or older
- Pap test – age 21 to 65
- Mammogram - age 40 or older

What will I pay for preventive screenings?

Preventive screenings are available at no cost in the Pinellas County sponsored UnitedHealthcare plans. Non-preventive (or diagnostic) services have a fee. An example of a diagnostic service would be a mammogram prescribed as a result of a breast lump found during an annual physical.

Do I have to wait 366 days before my next screening?

No. Screenings are covered annually per calendar year.

How do I submit documentation if I am an opt out?

Employees who opt out of the County health plan need to submit a copy of their Explanation of Benefits for designated preventive screenings by email to wellness@pinellascounty.org, by fax to (727) 464-5291, or by interoffice mail to Wellness, 400 S. Ft. Harrison Avenue, First Floor. Please block out any personal health information data as it is not necessary for earning incentives.
